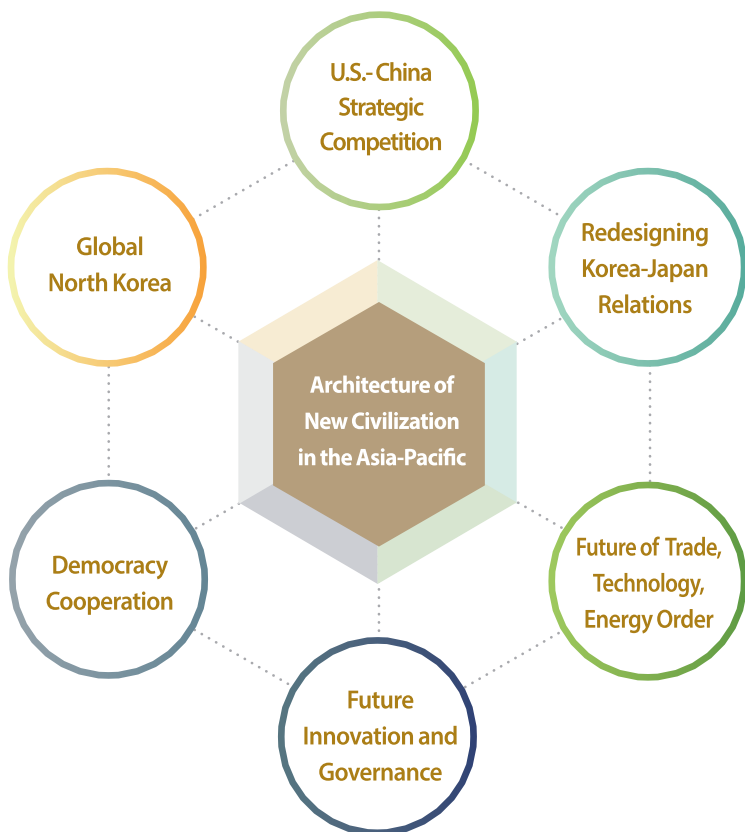

Regional Architecture under U.S.-China Strategic Competition



Rising China and New Civilization in the Asia-Pacific is a mid to long-term project established by EAI in 2018. It aims to envision a desirable Asia-Pacific order and propose effective ways in which Korea may accommodate China's rise and lead sustainable development within the region.

EAI Online Seminar Series: "After Trump" consist of four online sessions that discuss and analyze the 2020 U.S. presidential election, the prospect of U.S.-Korea cooperation, vision for the alliance, and economic decoupling between U.S. and China. The seminar invites discussions among scholars and researchers from a wide variety of fields, including political science, law, international studies, international relations, and public administration.

Global North Korea

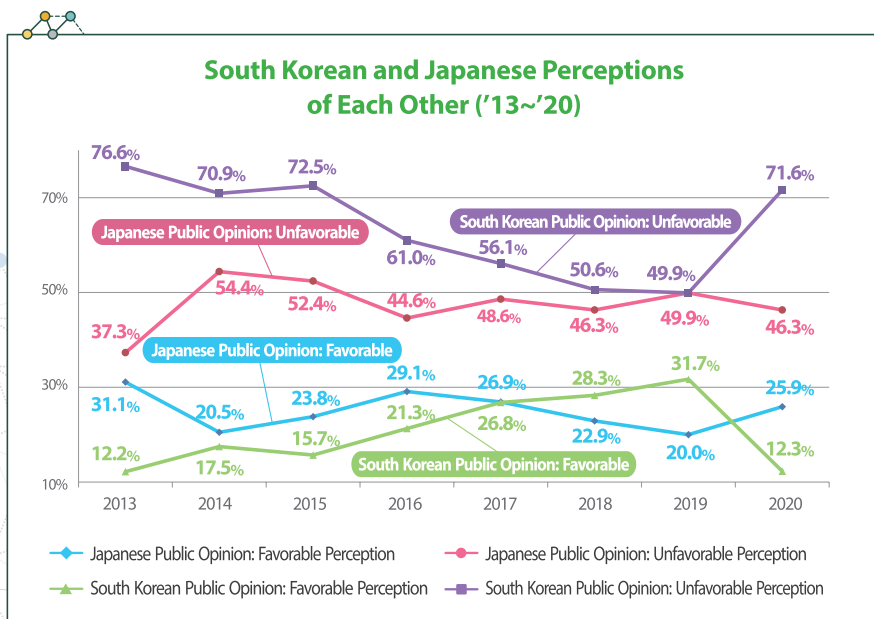
Global North Korea is a comprehensive archival website launched in 2018 whose aim is to provide strategic analysis of the North Korea problem. The website archives documents published in five countries (South Korea, North Korea, the U.S., China, and Japan) and offers a statistical overview which viewers can reference to identify the changing perceptions of North Korea.





Redesigning Korea-Japan Relations

Since 2013, EAI has conducted public opinion surveys of both Korean and Japanese citizens with The Genron NPO, a Japanese think tank, on major bilateral and regional issues. EAI has also held timely debate sessions with an audience and a panel comprised of individuals from all age groups to discuss public perceptions of the two countries.





Future of Trade, Technology, Energy Order



The EAI Center for Trade, Technology, and Transformation was established in 2019 to analyze how interactions between economy, technology and security lead to changes in the international order. In doing so, the center aims to improve the future prospects of this phenomenon. The center promotes studies on the future of U.S.-China competition, the changing political and economic order, and global digital governance.

Democracy Cooperation

EAI pursues democracy promotion in Asia through active domestic and international research. As three main projects in this field, the **Asia Democracy Research Network (ADRN)**, **Strengthening Civil Society Organizations in Myanmar**, and the **National Democratic Institute (NDI)** projects have helped strengthen regional capacity building and develop democratic solidarity through a knowledge network.



The ADRN aims to contribute to democracy promotion and consolidation.



EAI aims to support nascent think tanks to conduct policy research on the process of democratization in Myanmar.



With support of NDI, EAI launched the South Korea Democracy Storytelling Project in 2020.



EAI provides policy recommendations on both domestic Korean politics and foreign policy. Some of EAI's key projects include research on **Korean Identity** and its **Evolving Electorate**, which began in 2005. These projects help raise public discussions about historical assessment, civic participation and conflict awareness. To further these efforts, EAI established the Center for Innovative Future in 2019. The center's research activities include a policy debate on President Moon Jae-in's mid-term assessment and a study of **BTS** and **their contribution to the nation's attractive power**.

Future Innovation and Governance



During the 2020 Korean Identity Research Joint Academic Conference, EAI discussed a variety of issues such as views of Korean history, social participation, perceptions of social conflicts, and perceptions of foreign affairs.

Council of Councils

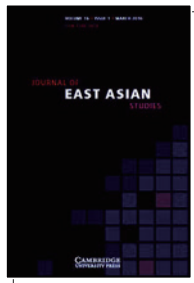

CoC promotes cross-institutional dialogue on global governance and multilateral cooperation. As CoC's representative of Korea, EAI leads discussions on security issues related to the Korean Peninsula.

ROK-U.S. Think Tank Joint Seminar

EAI holds joint seminars annually with U.S. think tanks on public diplomacy with the support of the Korean Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MoFA). Joint seminars aim to promote mutual understanding and bilateral cooperation at public and private levels through policy discussions on security, economy, and diplomacy.

Since 2005, EAI has studied the concept of Korean identity by conducting public opinion surveys to analyze Korean perception of historical assessment, civic participation, conflict awareness and foreign policy awareness.



Narrating the Global Attractiveness of BTS

BTS has created a new paradigm for the international community that is otherwise divided by race, language, and nationality. To analyze the BTS phenomenon culturally and sociologically, EAI published this book after a series of online seminars with a research team of sociologists and international political scientists.

Academic Programs

EAI Sarangbang

An educational program designed to nurture future political experts and diplomats. A series of lectures are followed by field trips and publications.

EAI Academy

An academic program on the "Future of Korean Diplomacy" to nurture the next generation of public policy experts.

EAI Internship

Internship opportunities (ranging from 6 to 8 weeks) are granted to both undergraduate and graduate students.

EAI Scholarship

An annual academic scholarship program for students. Those who are selected are provided opportunities to participate in EAI's educational programs.
