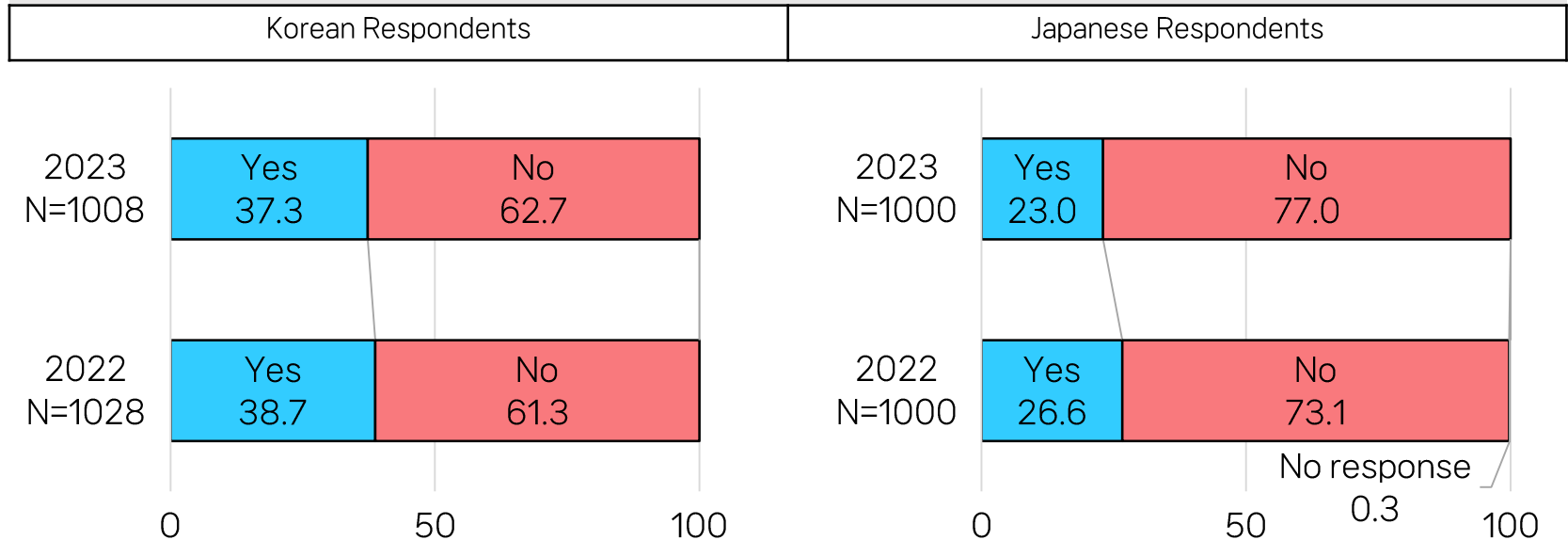

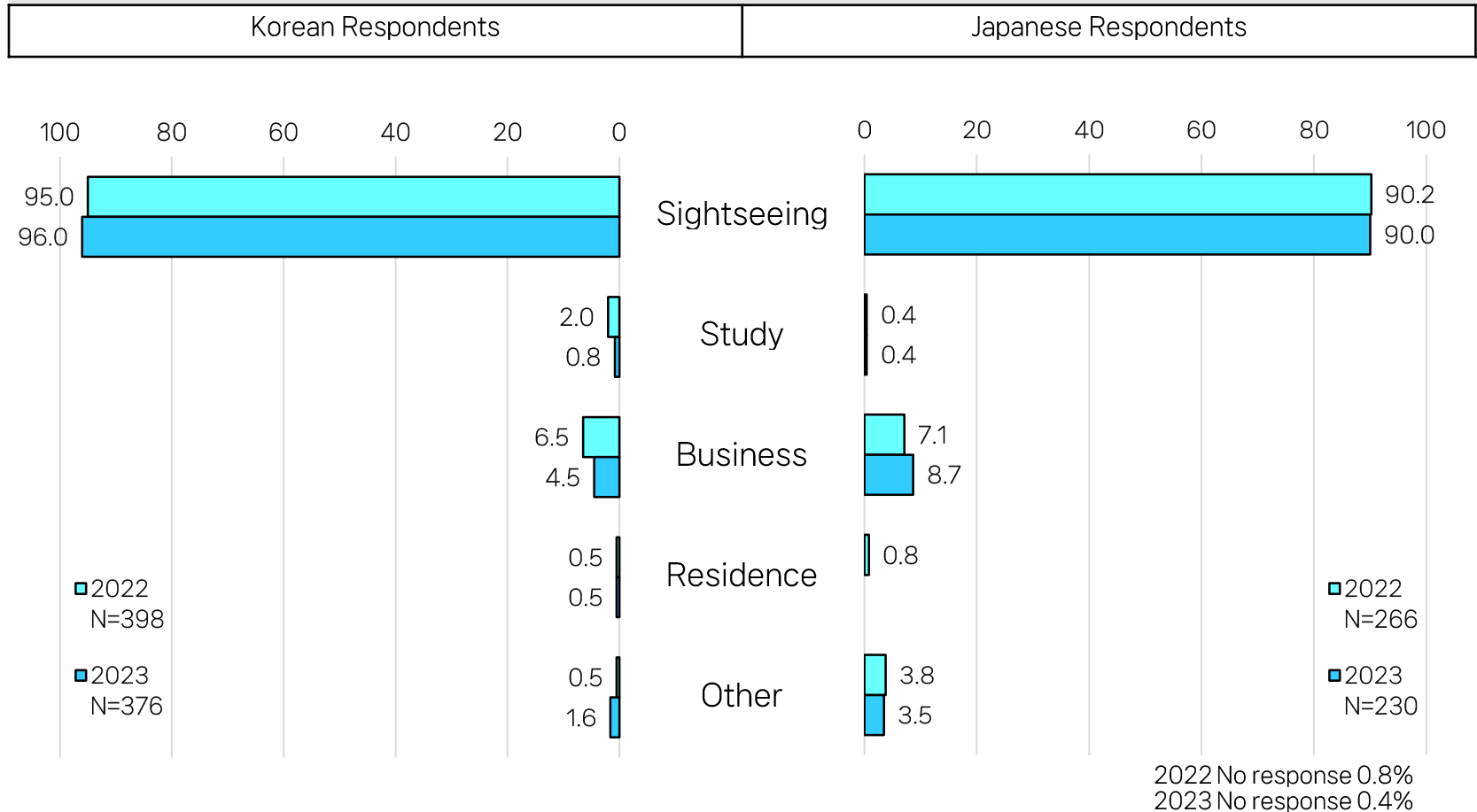

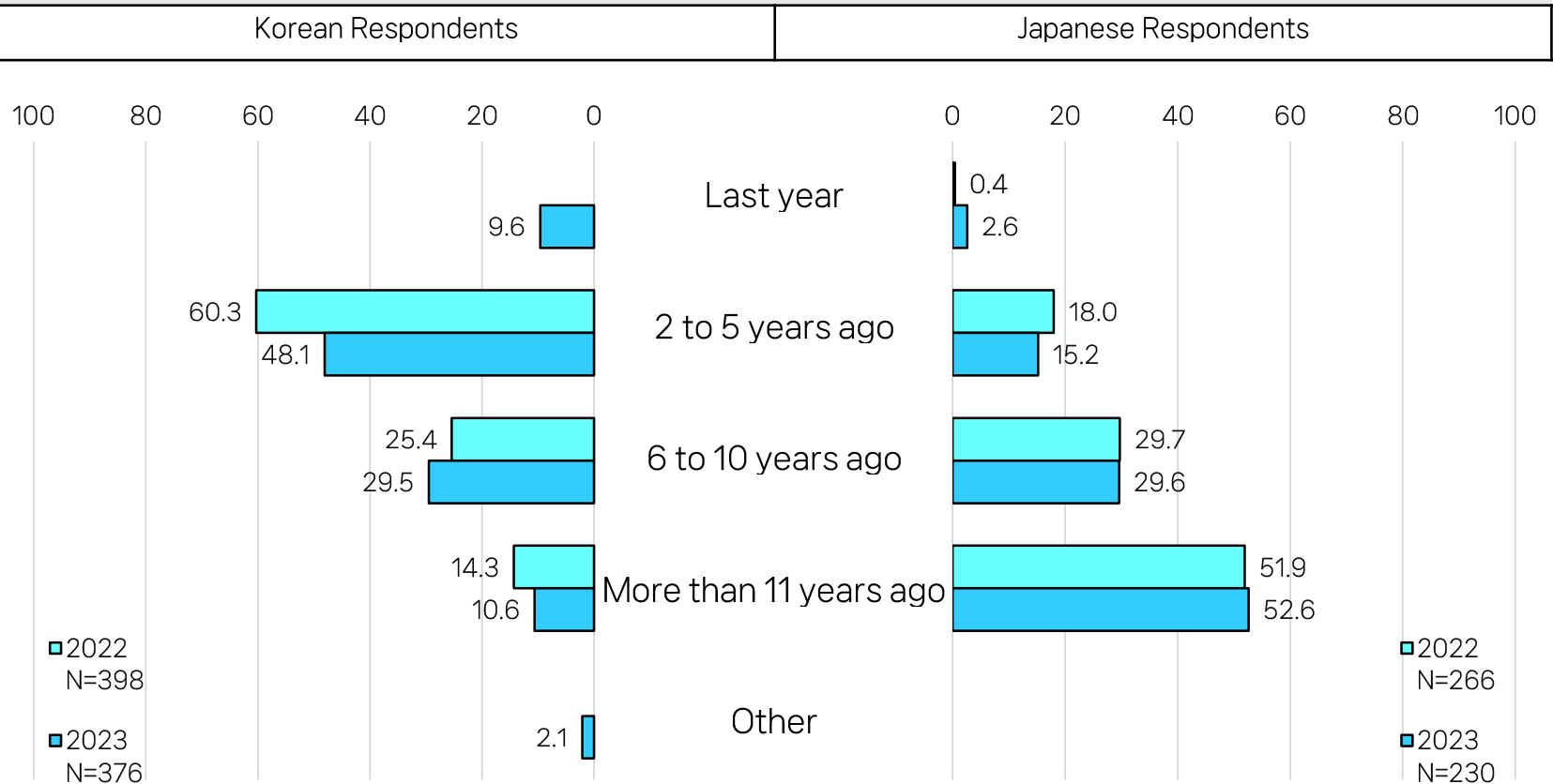

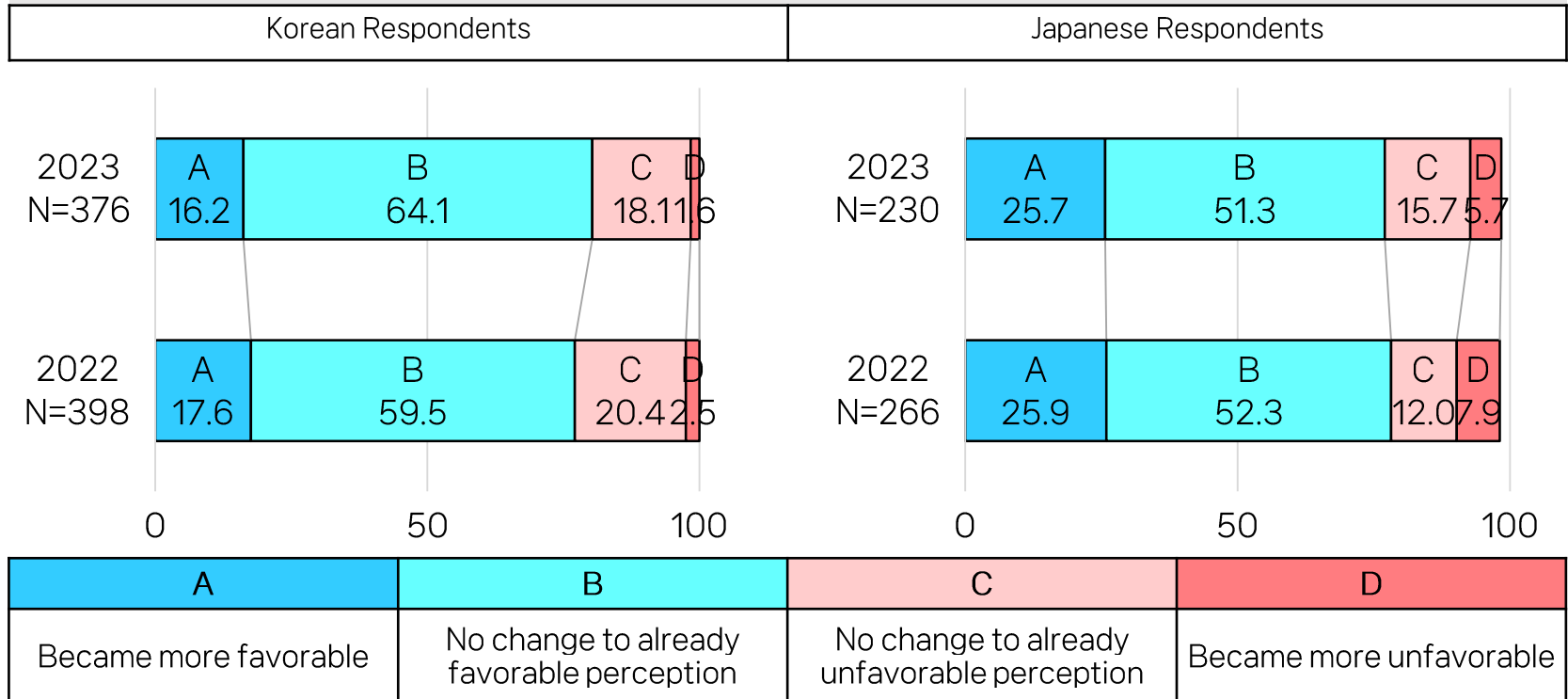

# Perception Change after Visiting the Other Country

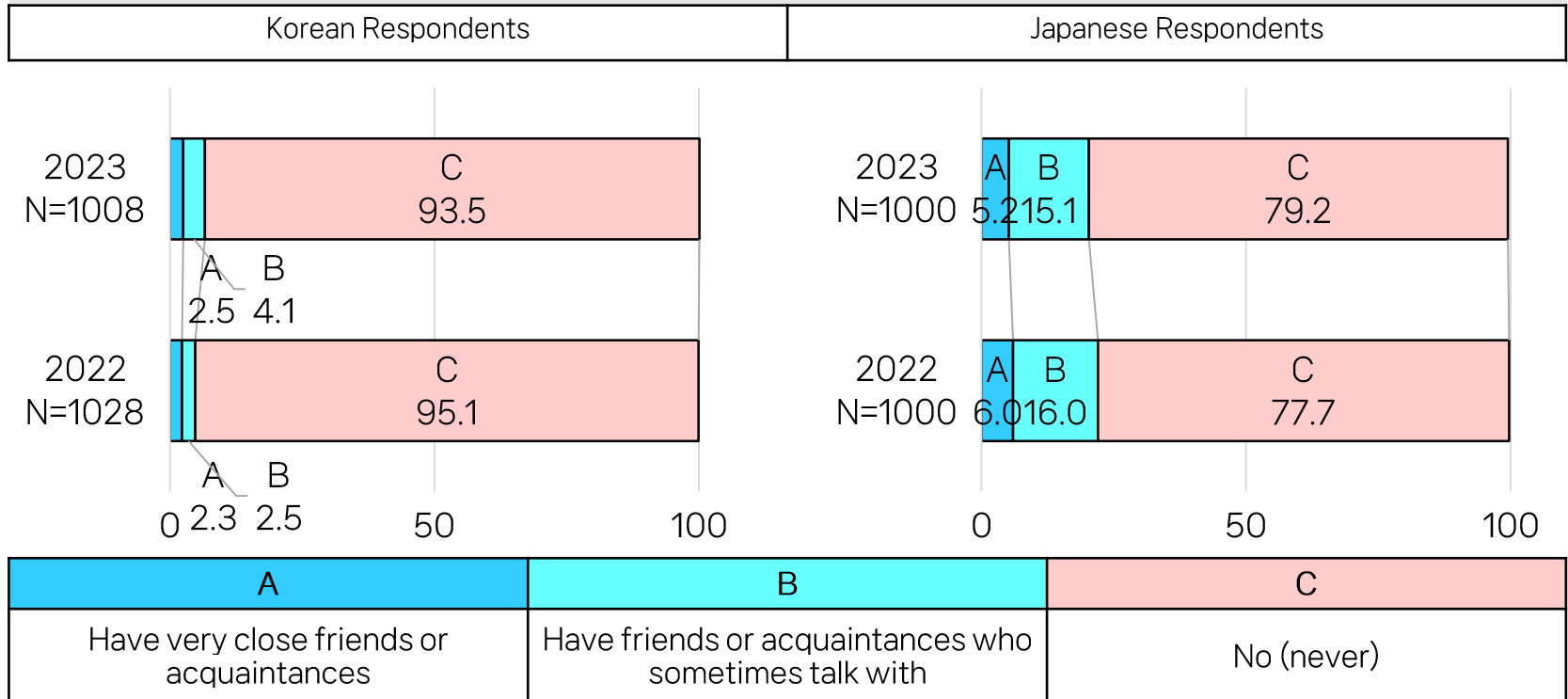
Q1-c. (Only those who answered "Yes" in Q1) Has your perception of Japan/South Korea changed following your visit? (%)

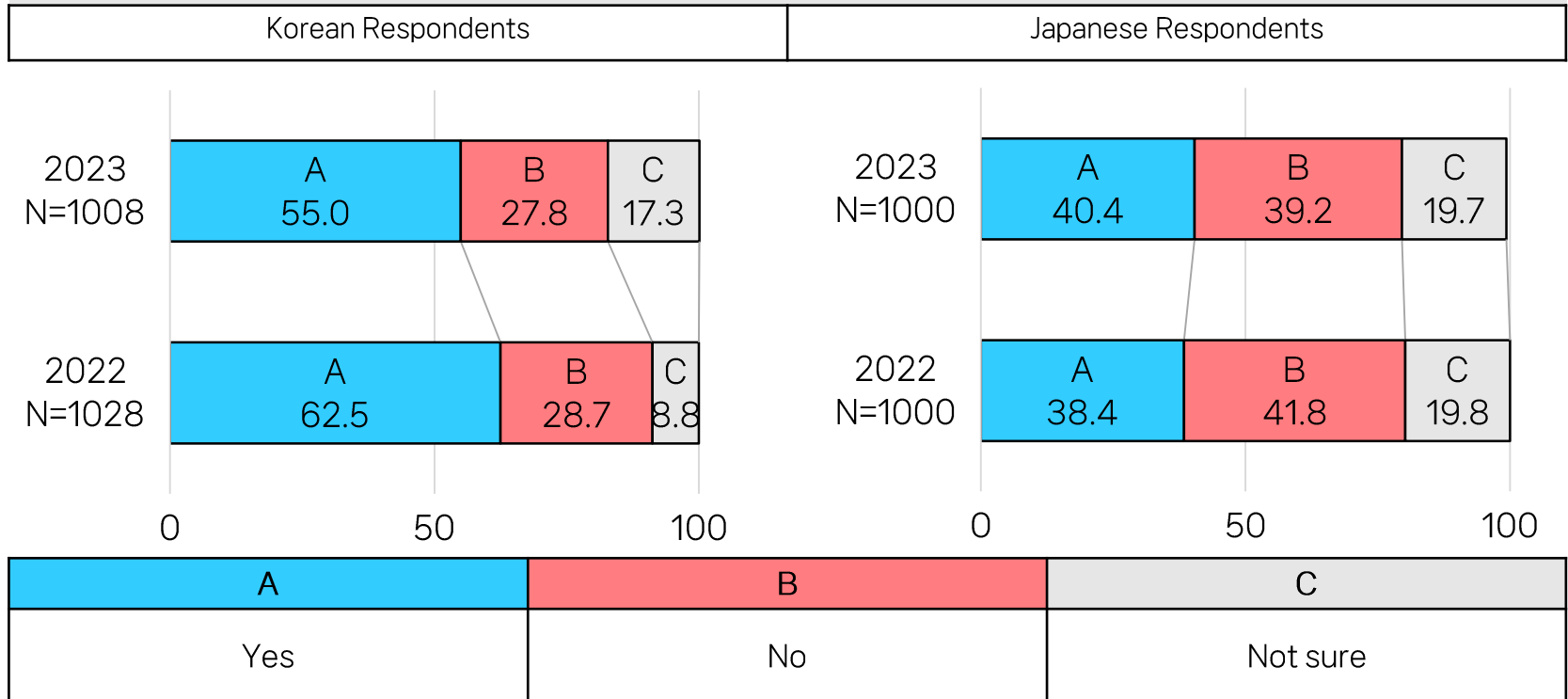
Q2. Do you have any friends or acquaintances in Japan/South Korea? (%)

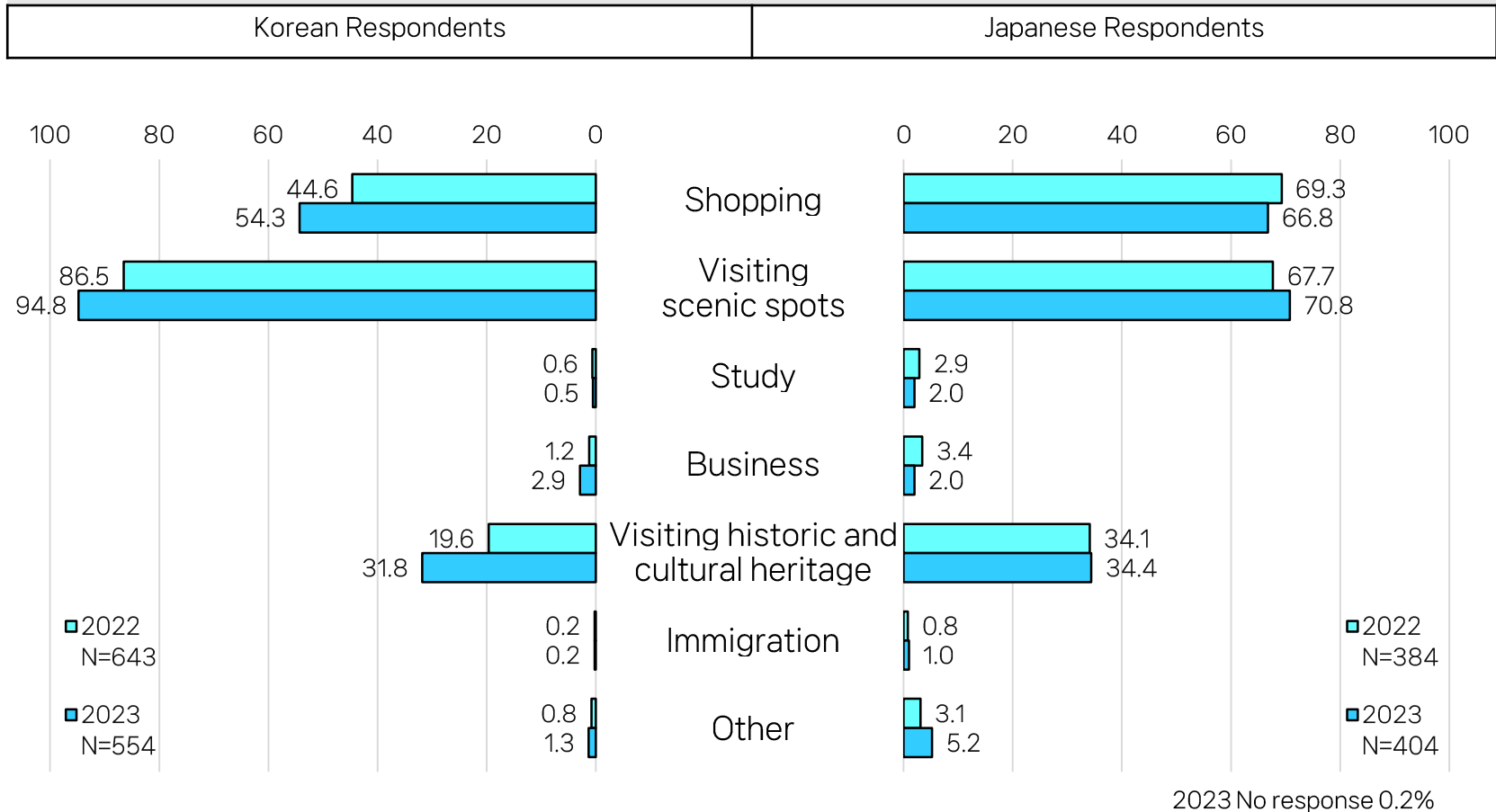

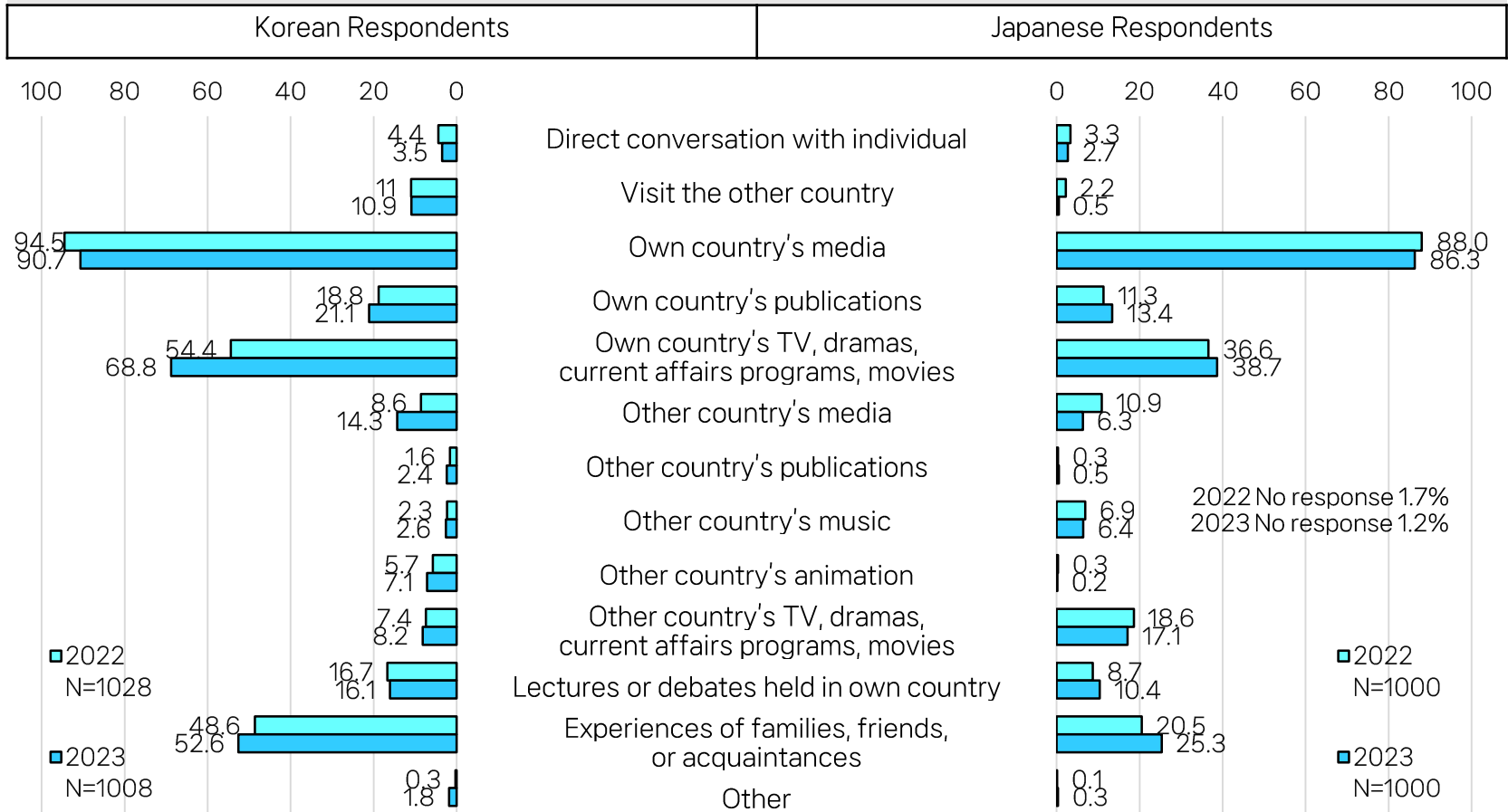

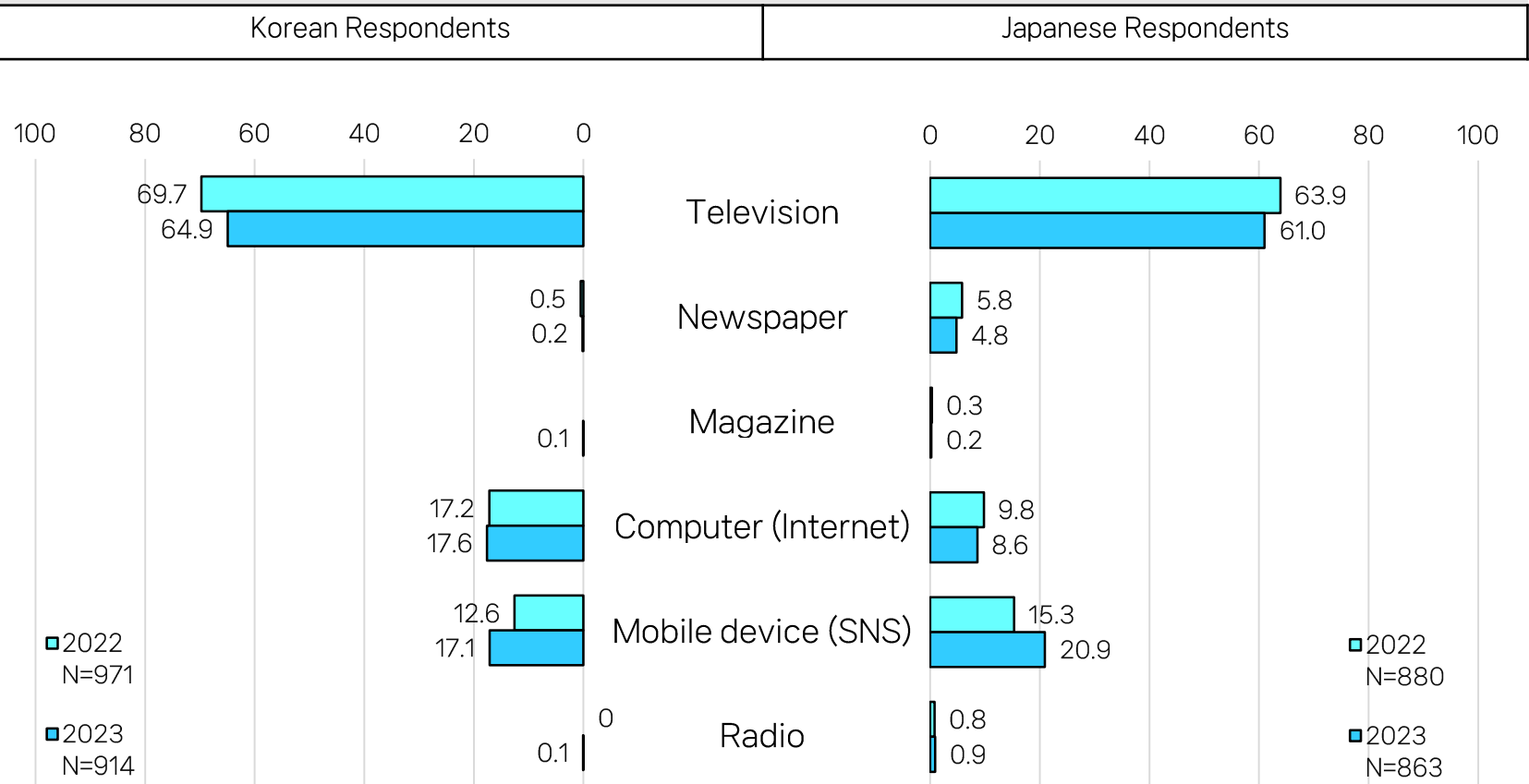
Q4. How do you usually get information about the other country or ROK-Japan relations? [Up to 3 responses]

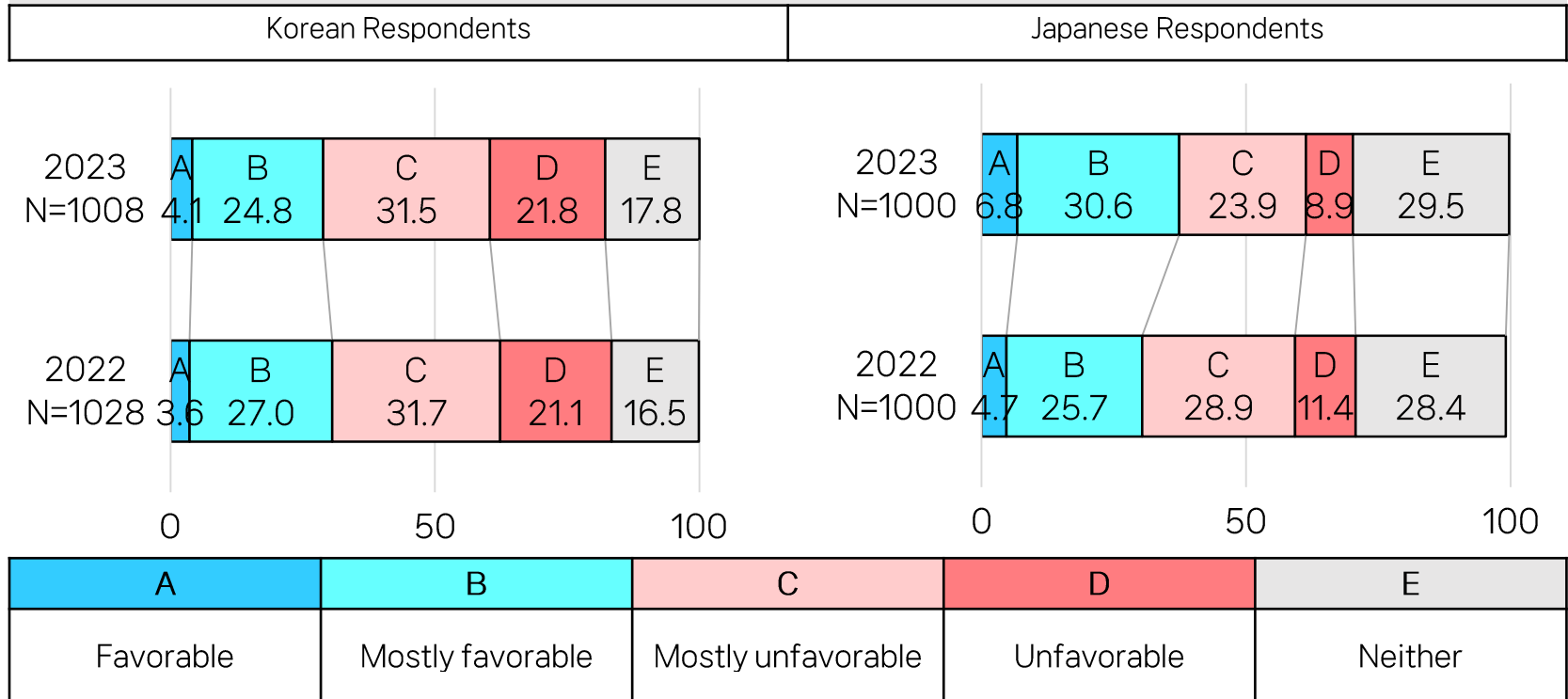

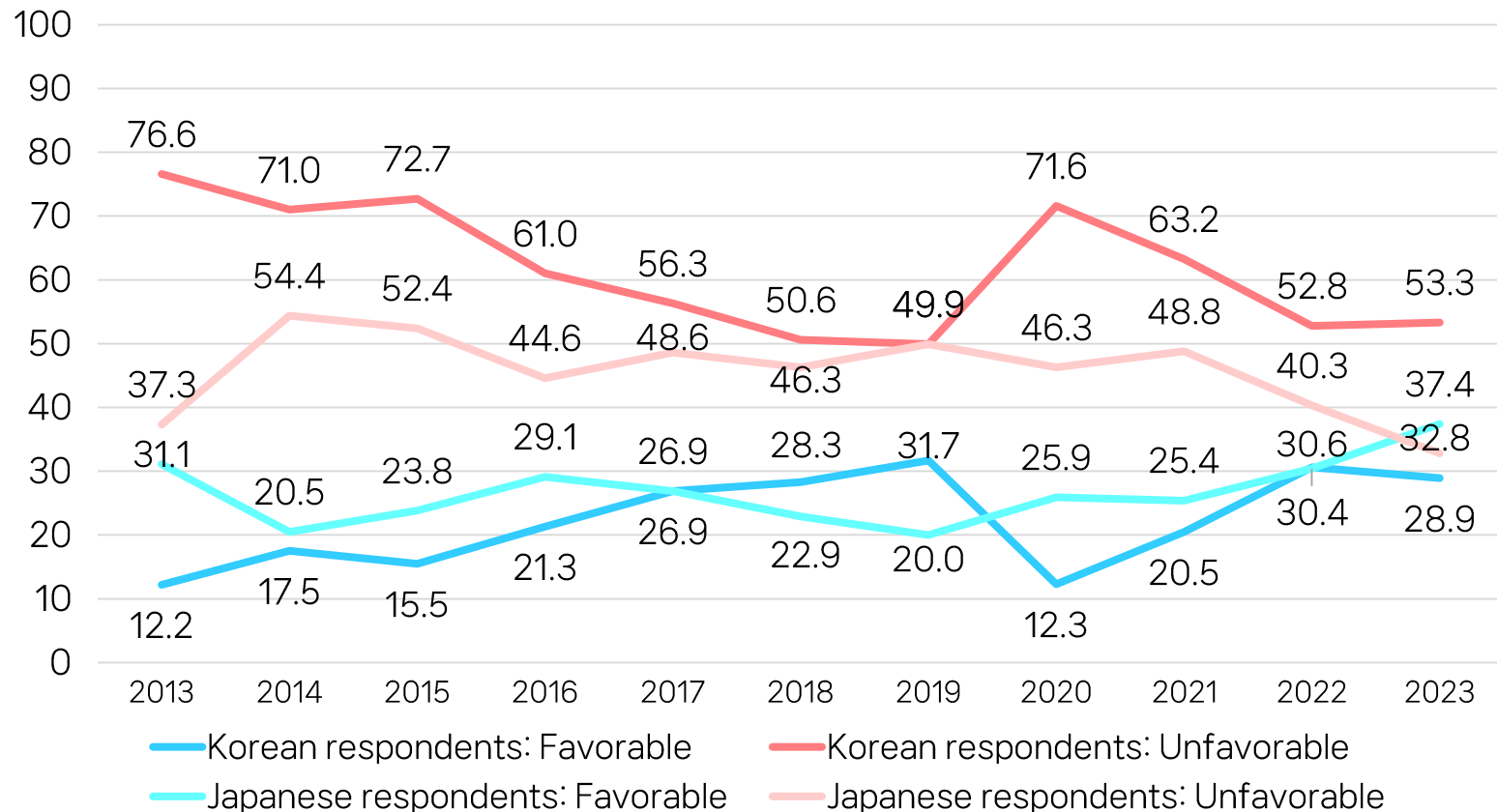

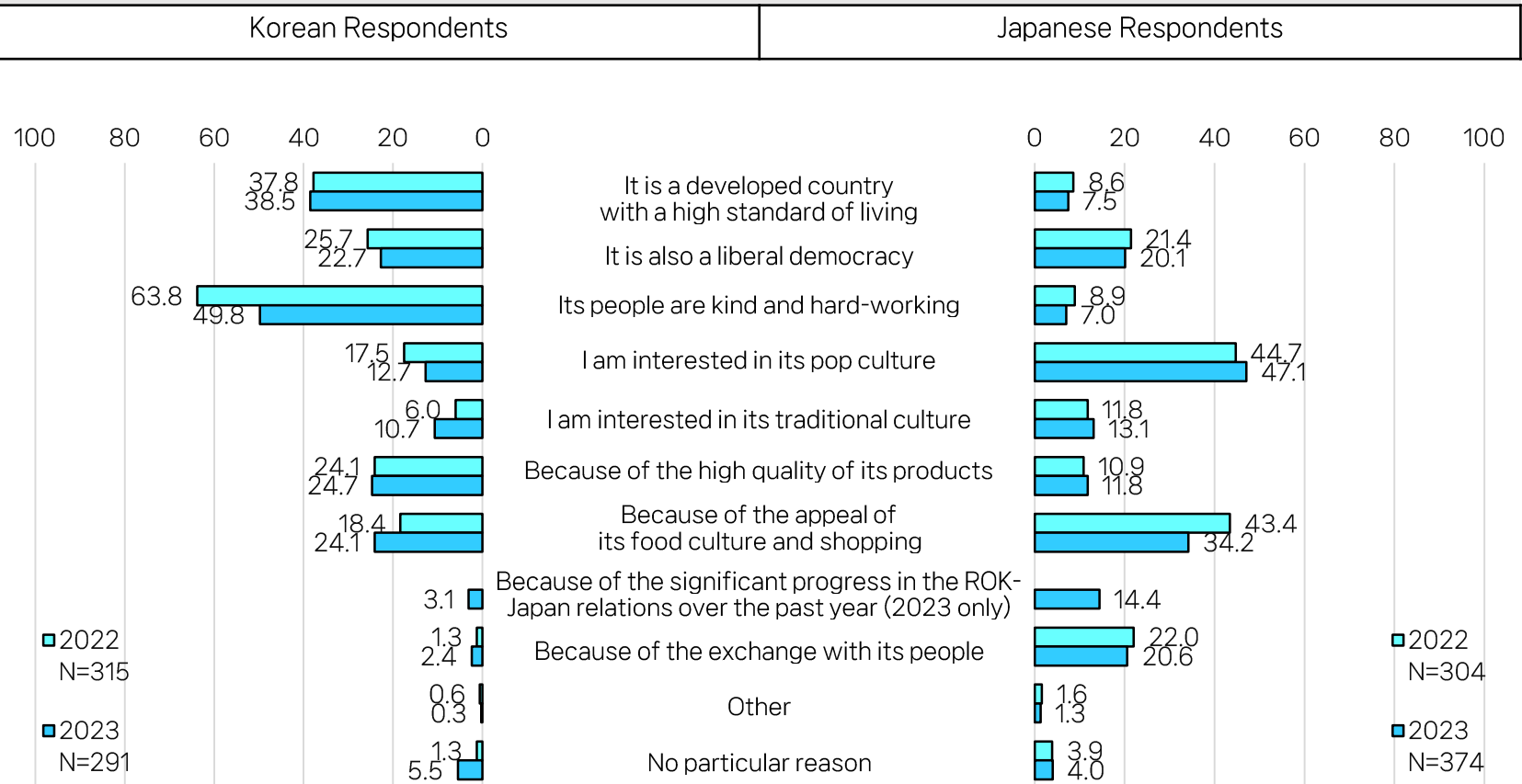

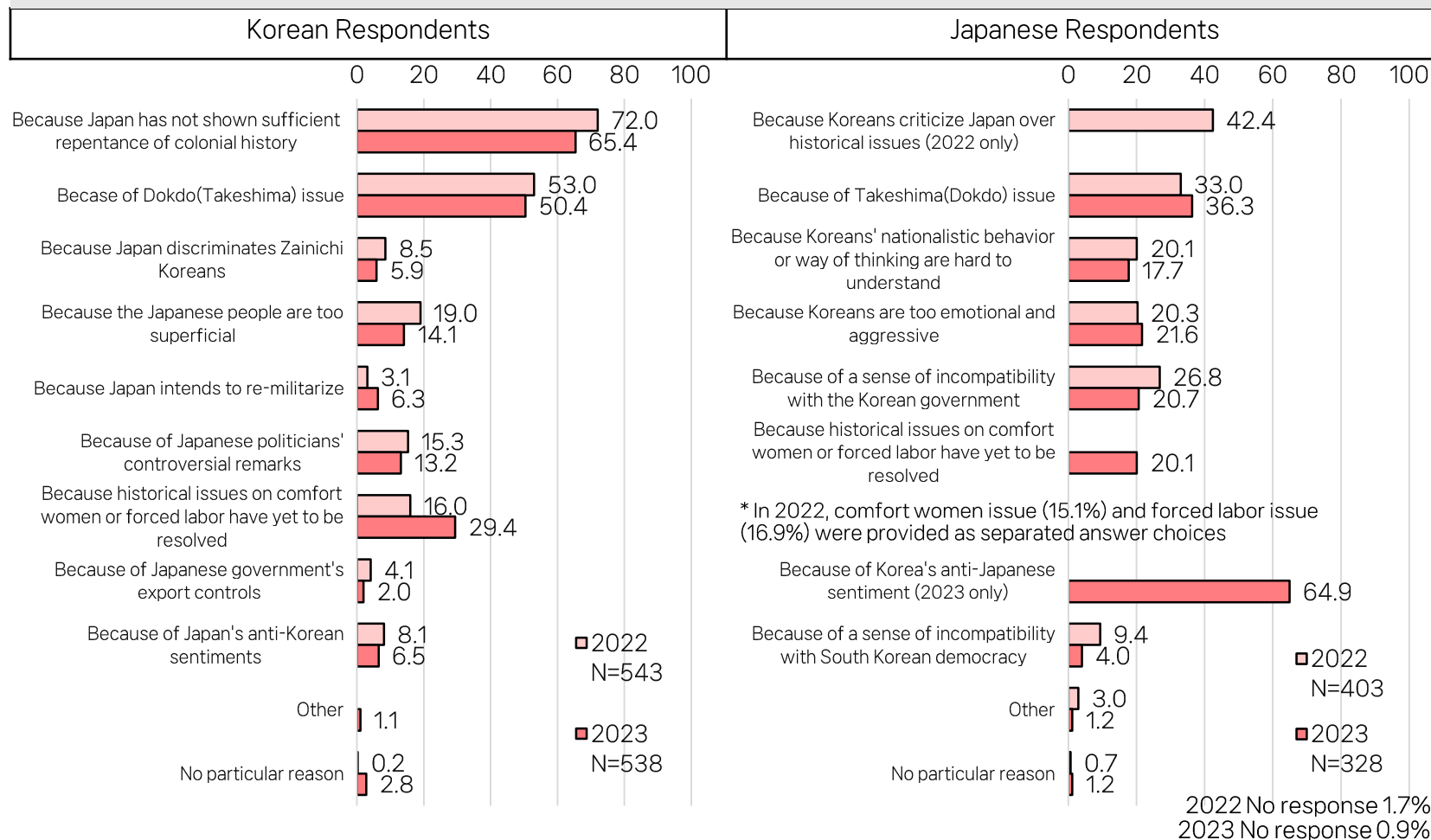

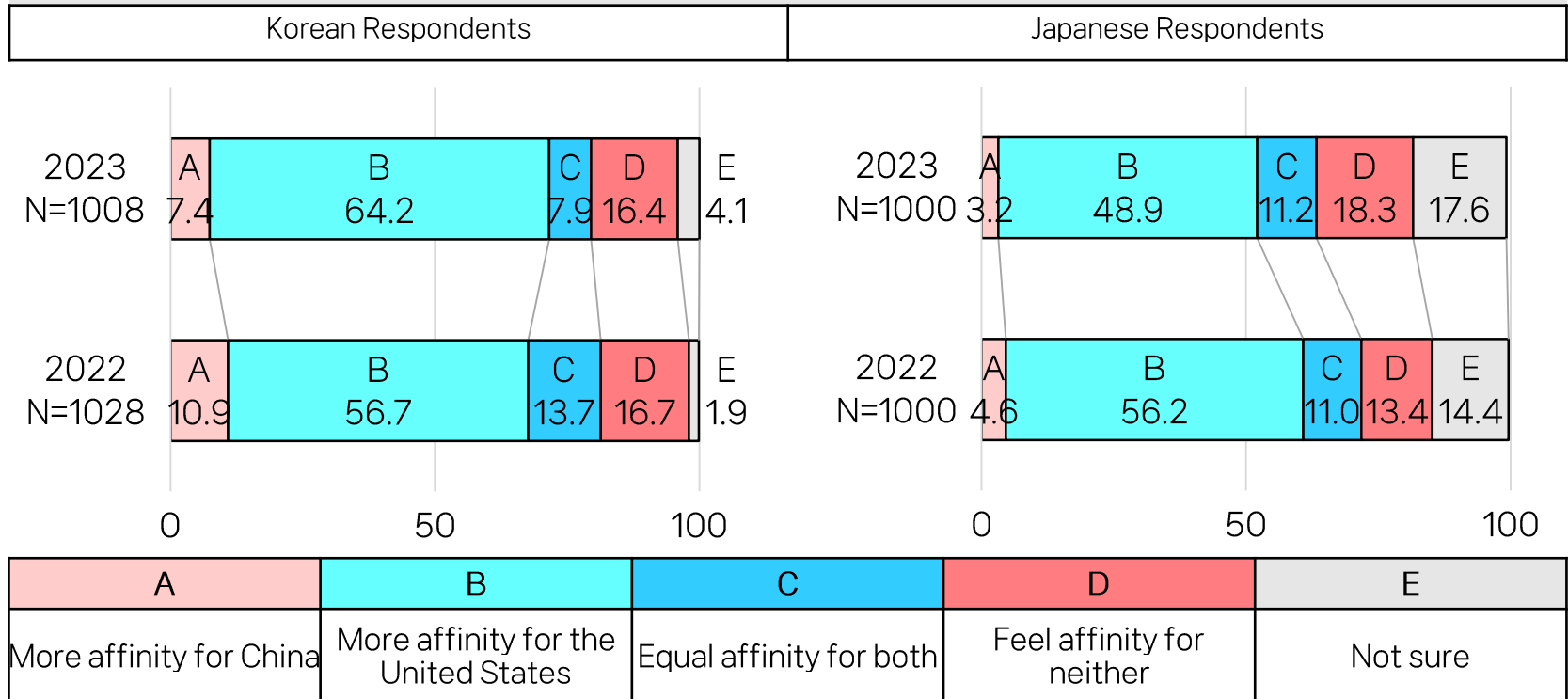

Q6. Which country do you feel a stronger affinity for: China or the United States? (%)

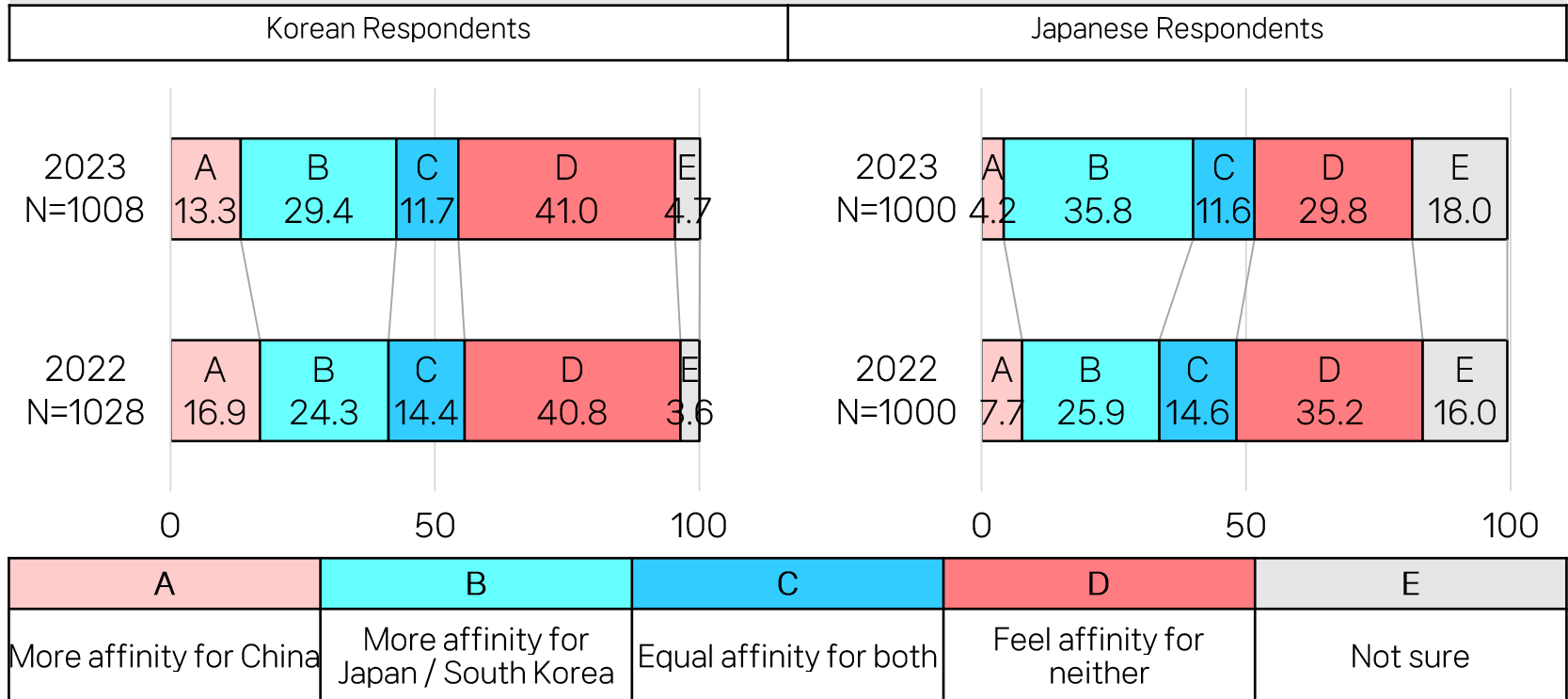

Q6. Which country do you feel a stronger affinity for: China or Japan/South Korea? (%)

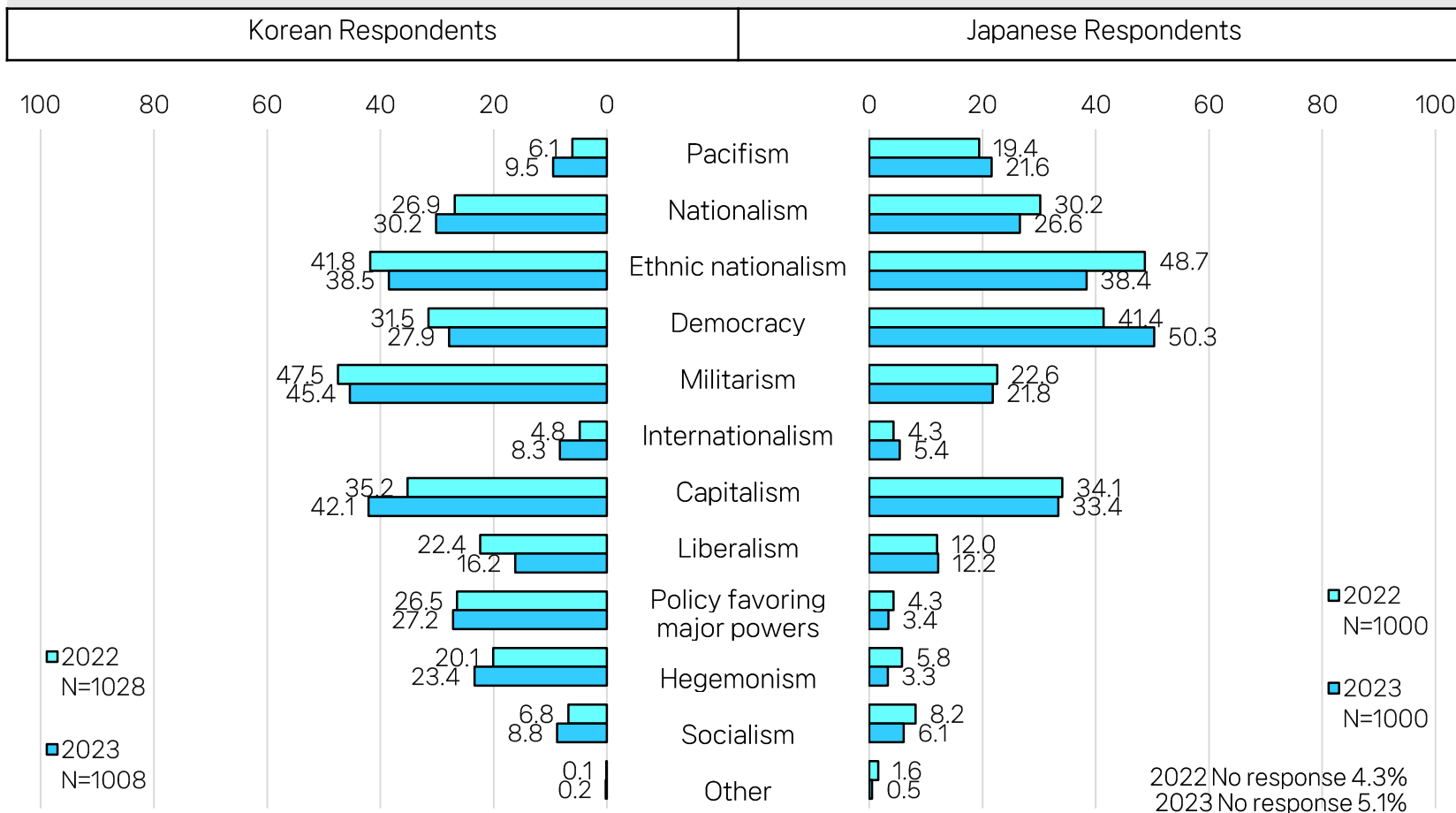

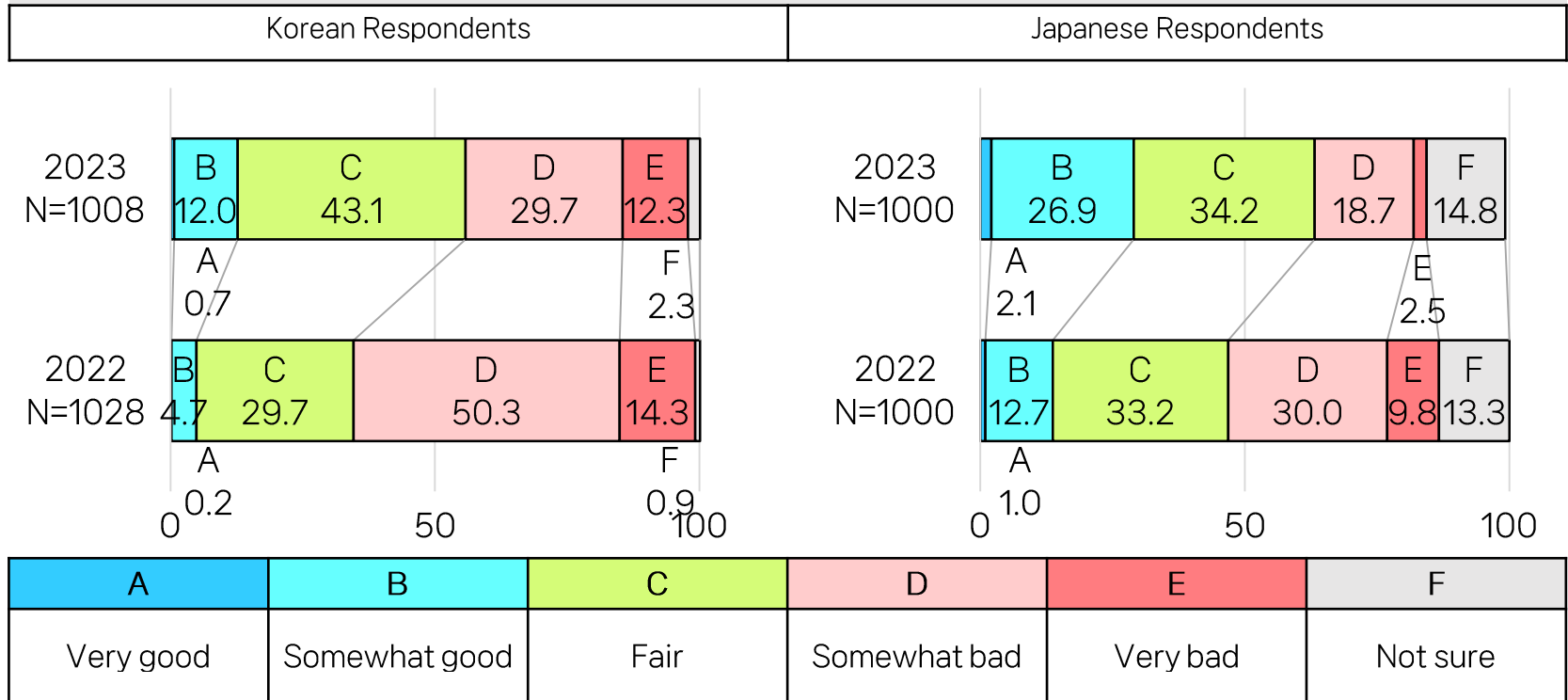

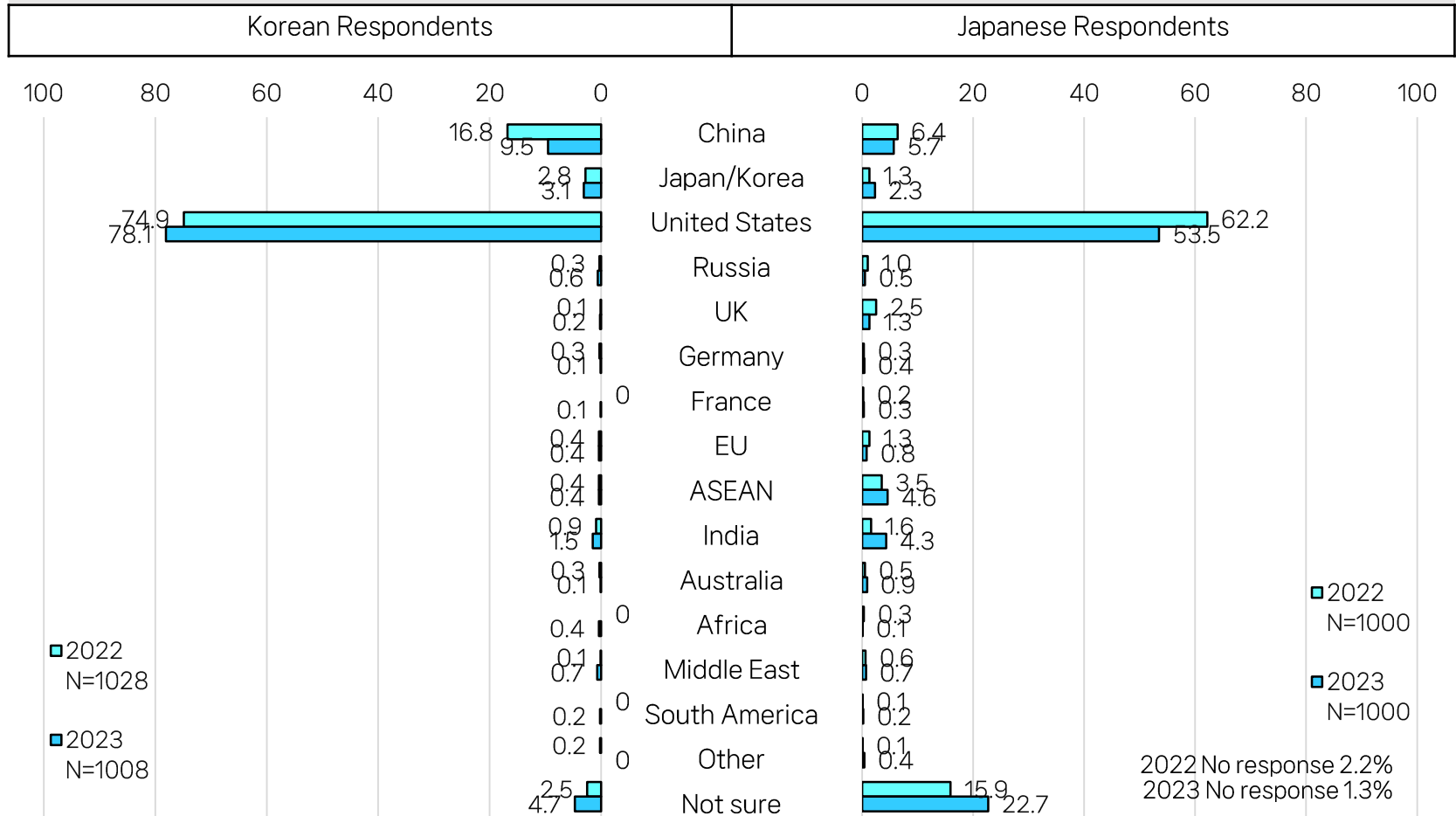
Q8. What do you think current relations between Korea and Japan are like? (%)

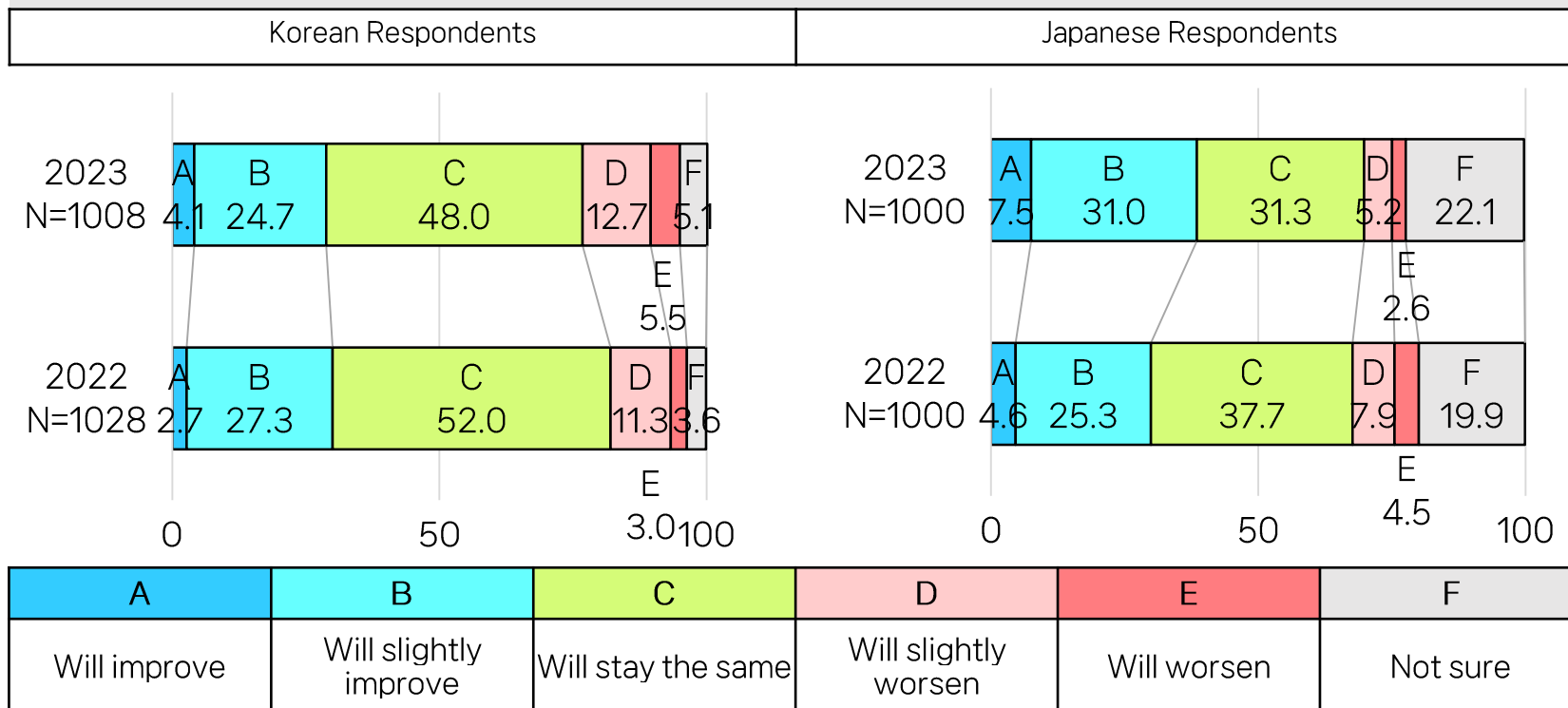
Q9. Considering the future, which of the following regions or countries do you consider to have the most important relationship with your own country? (%)

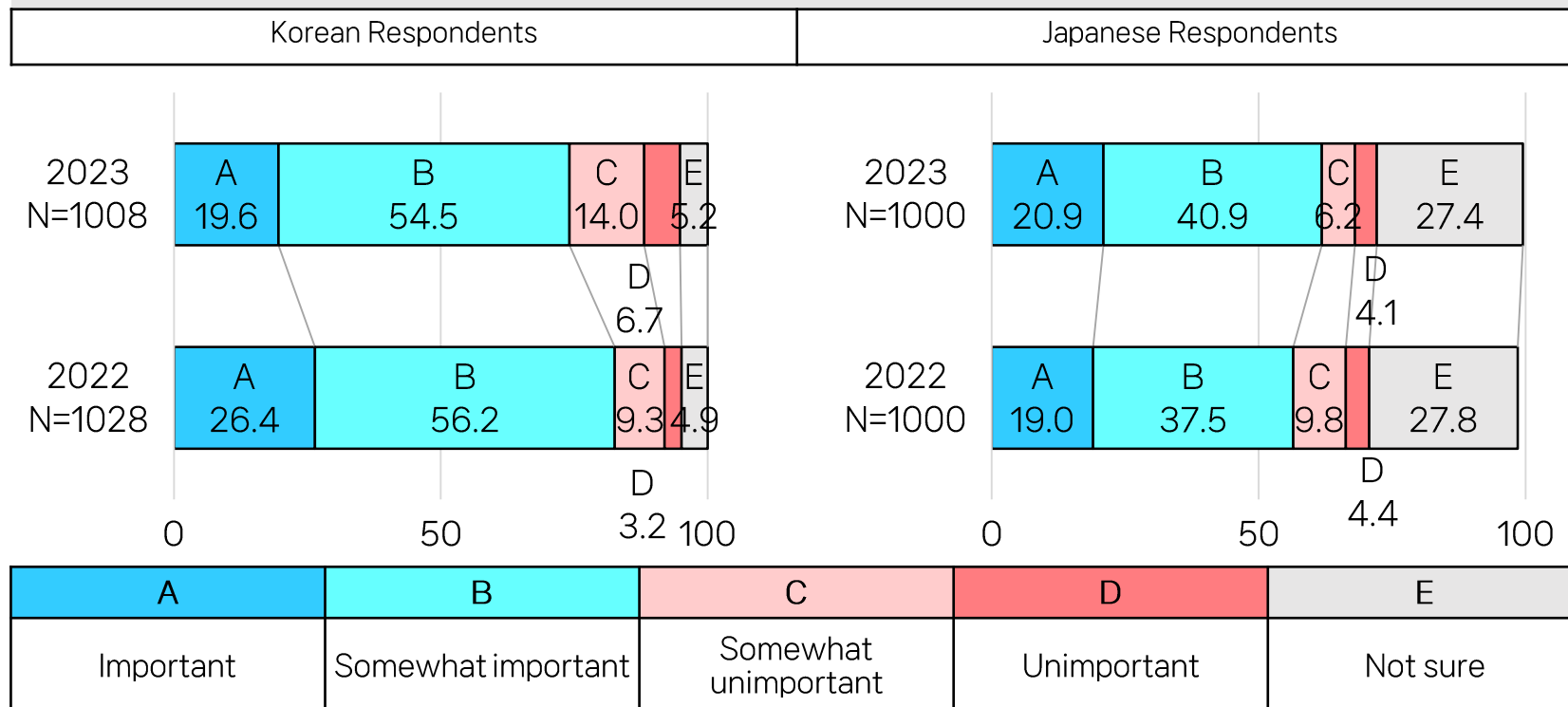

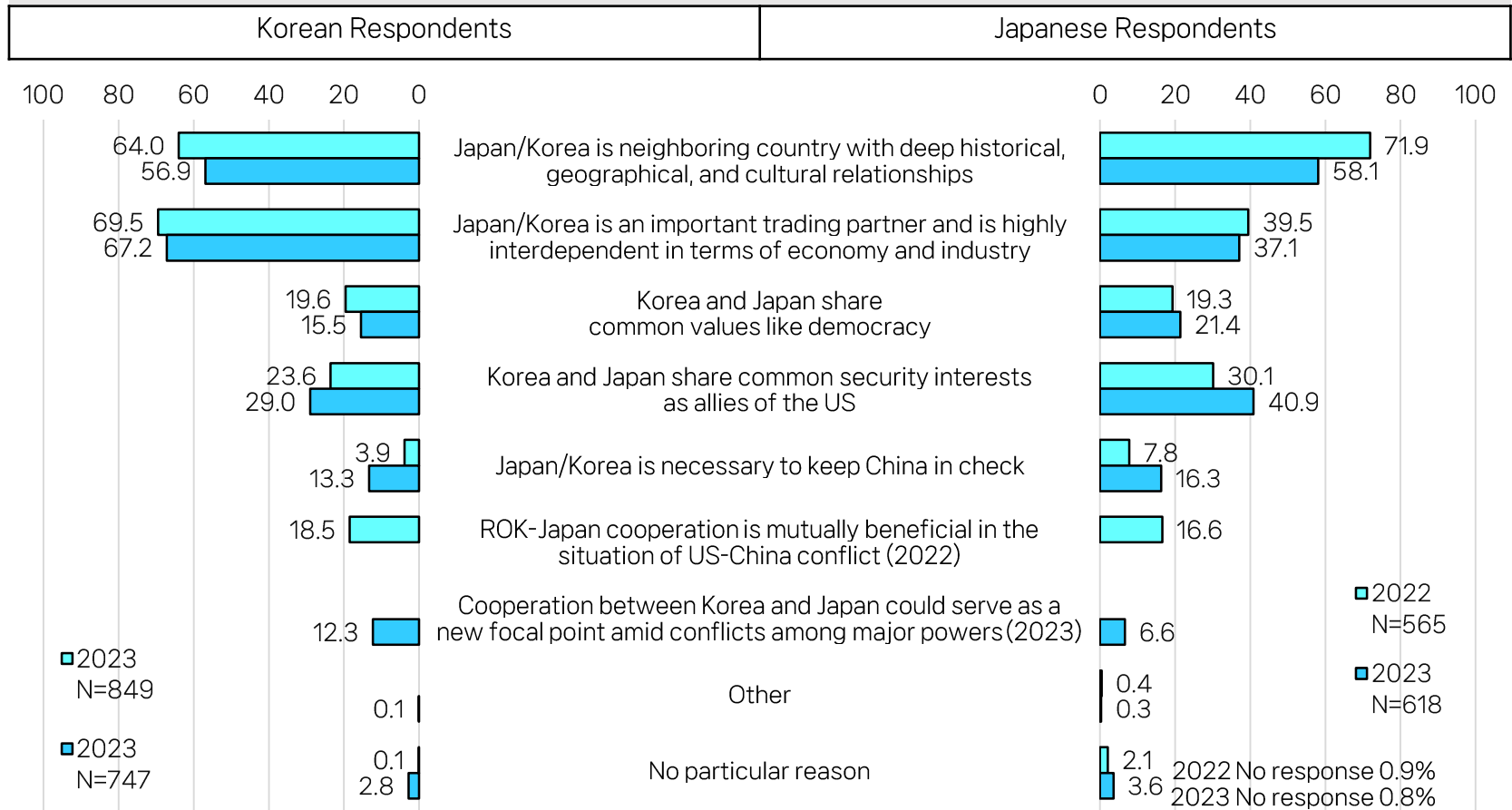
Q11. Currently, how important are the ROK-Japan relations to your own country? (%)

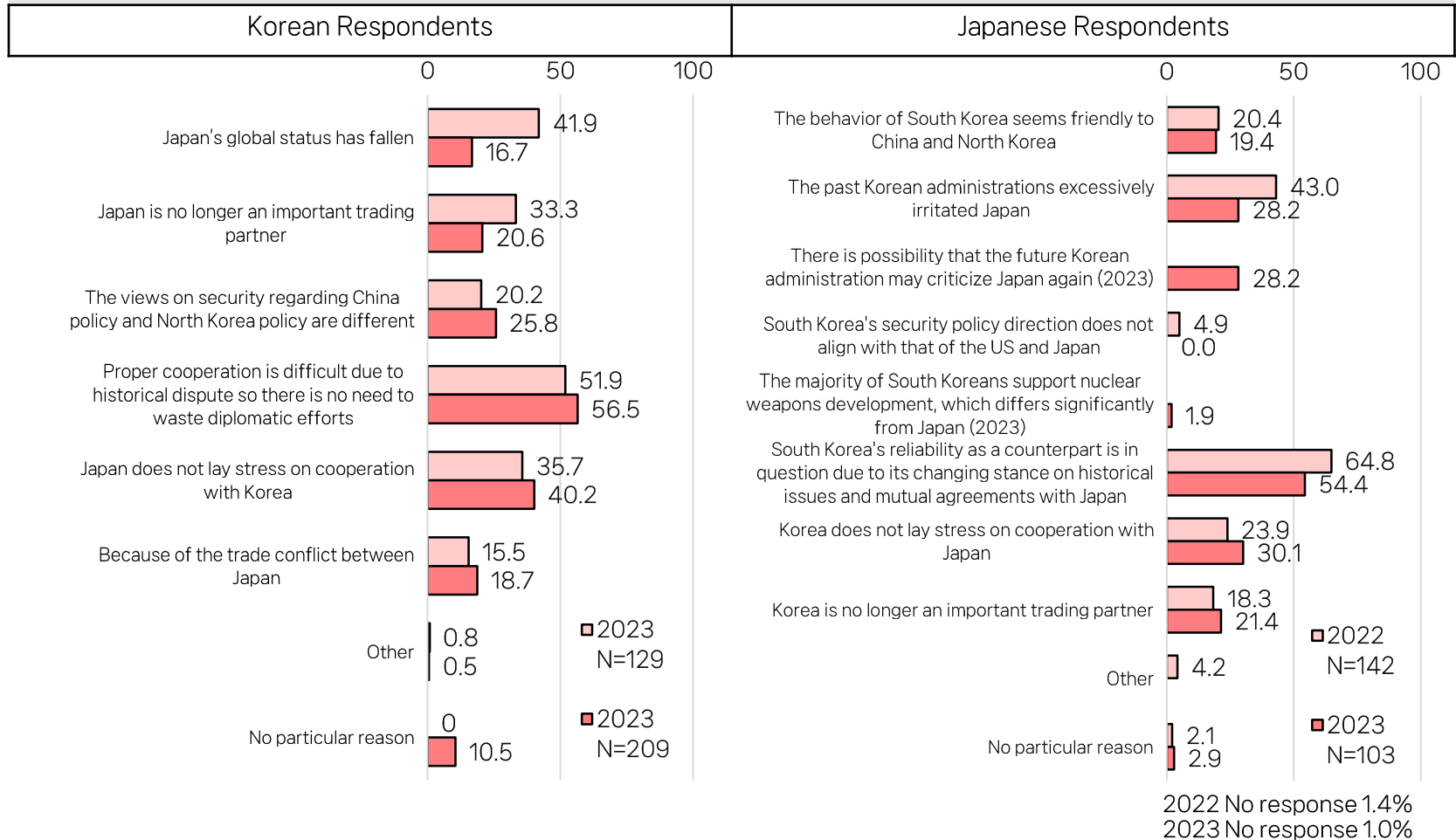

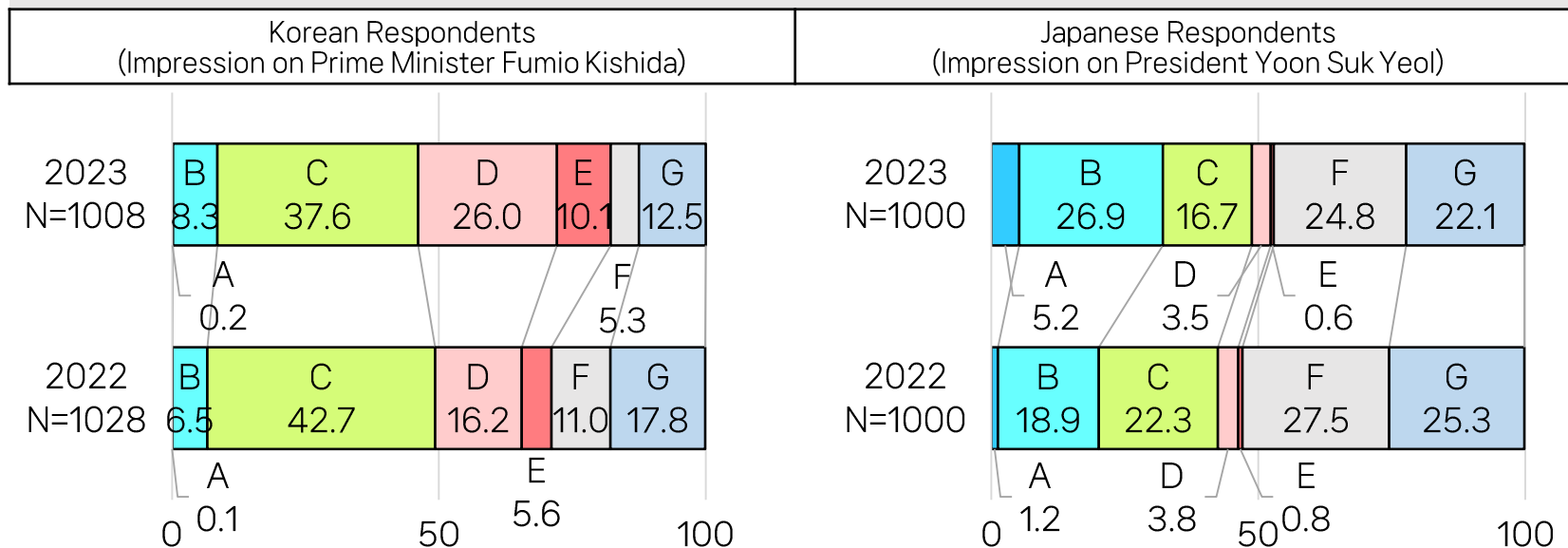

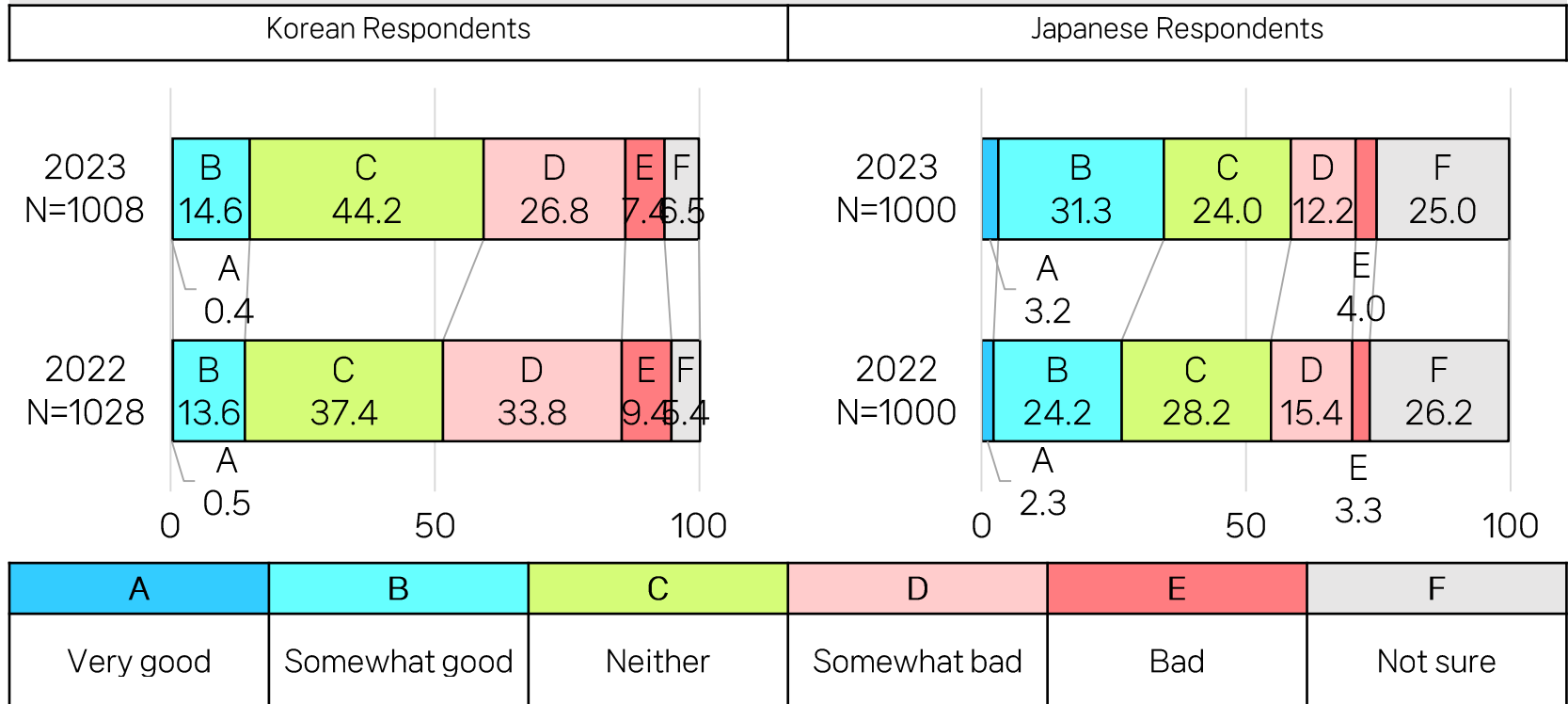

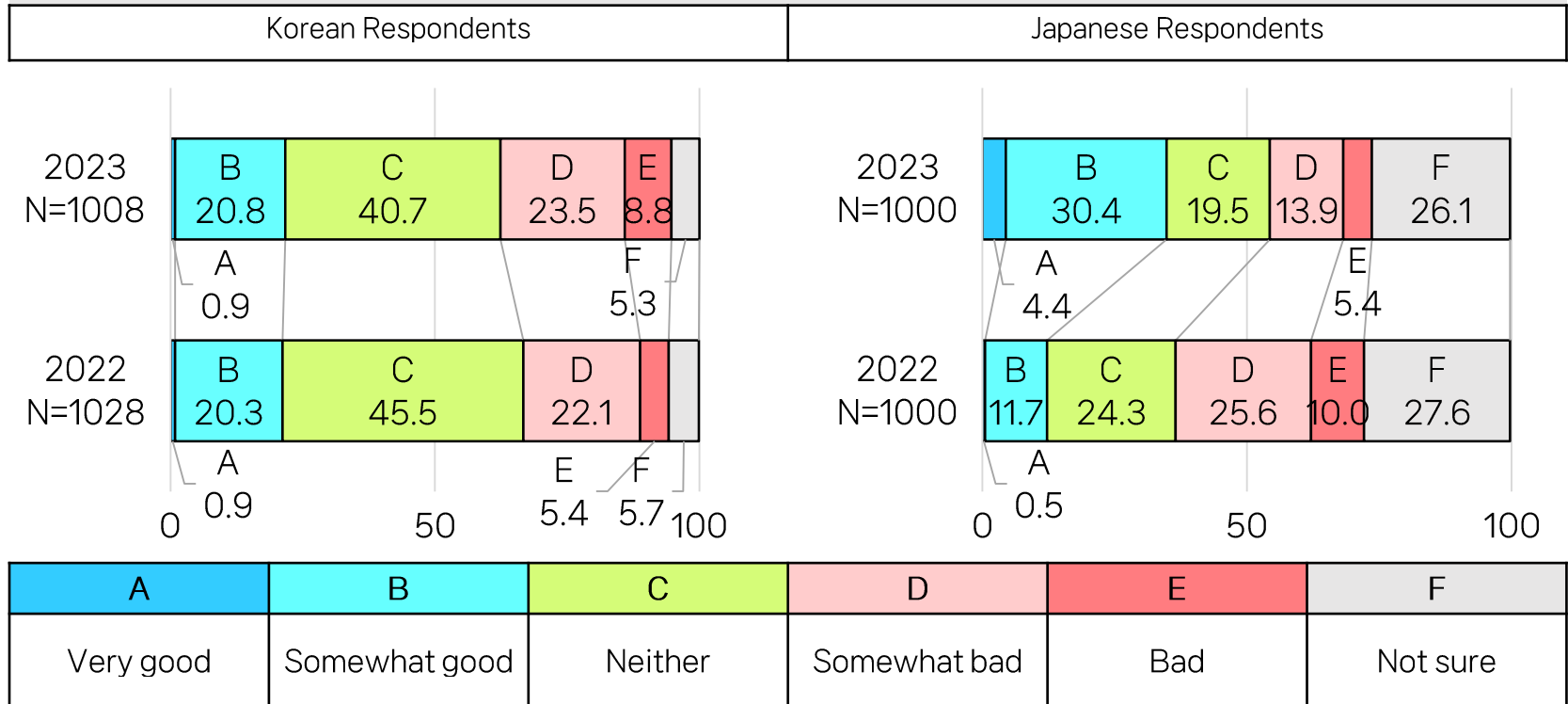
Q13. What is your assessment on the Japanese government's attitude towards improving relations with South Korea? (%)

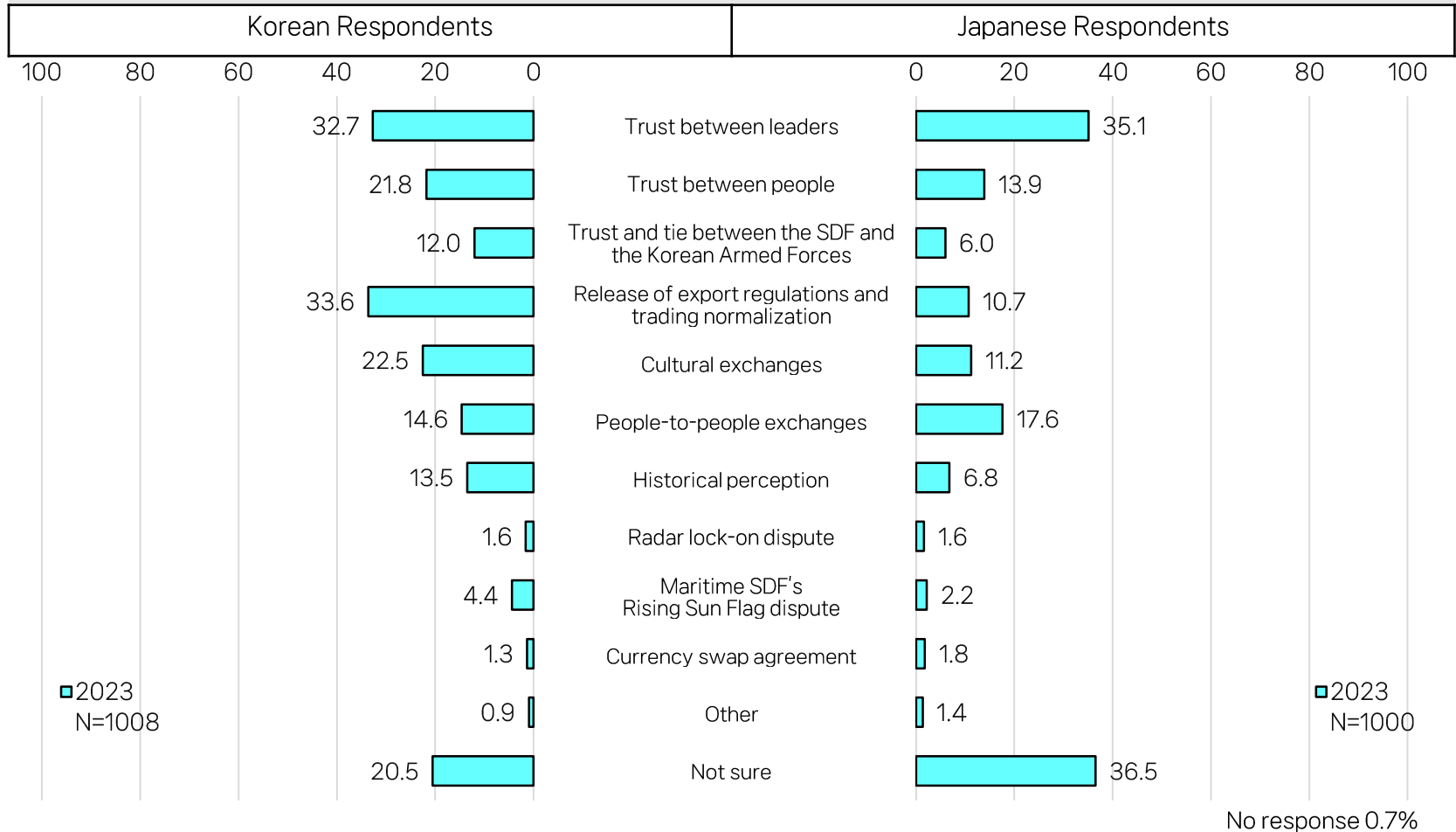

Q15. Since last year, which area of the ROK-Japan relations do you think has improved the most? [Up to 2 responses]

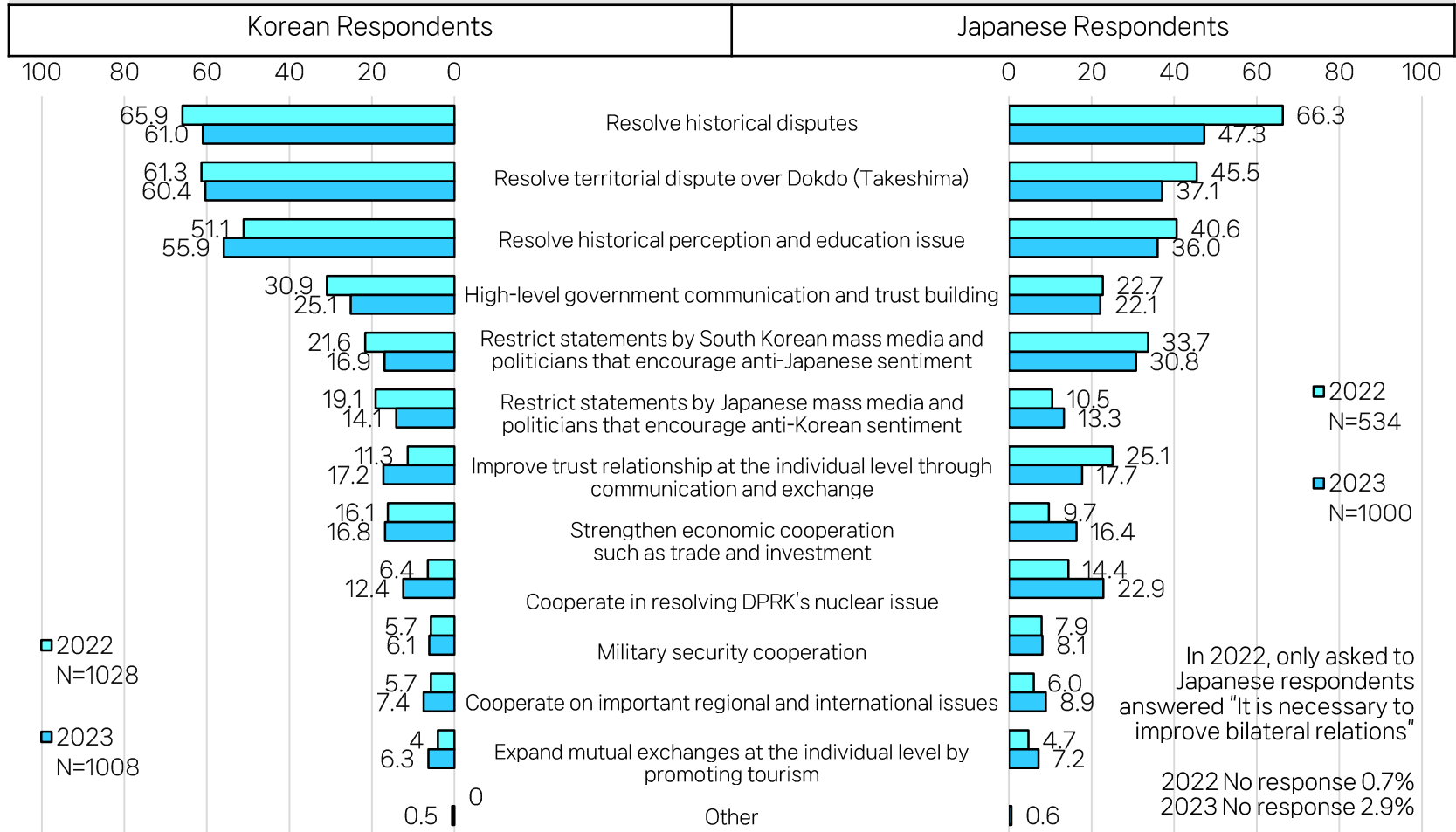

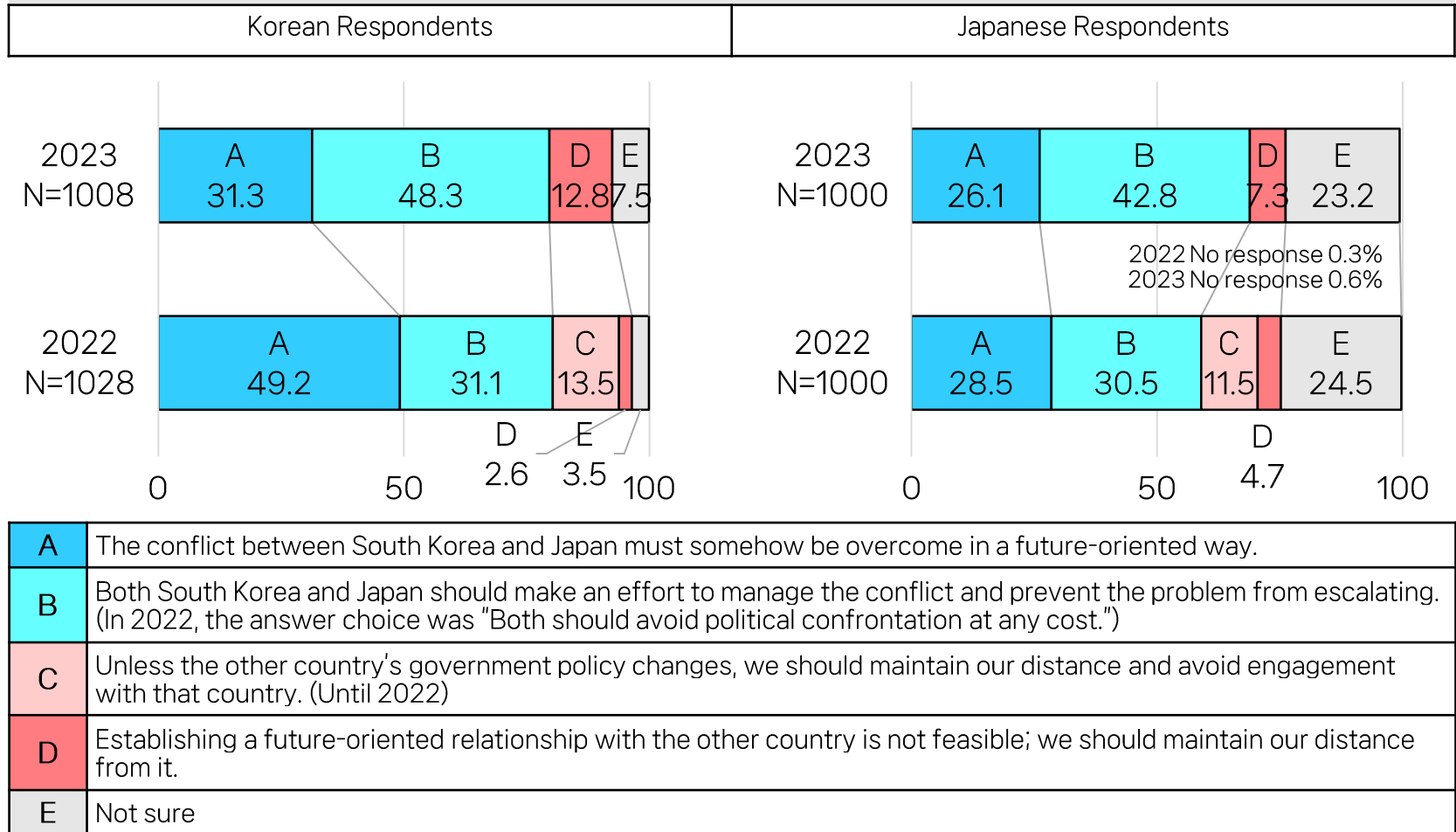

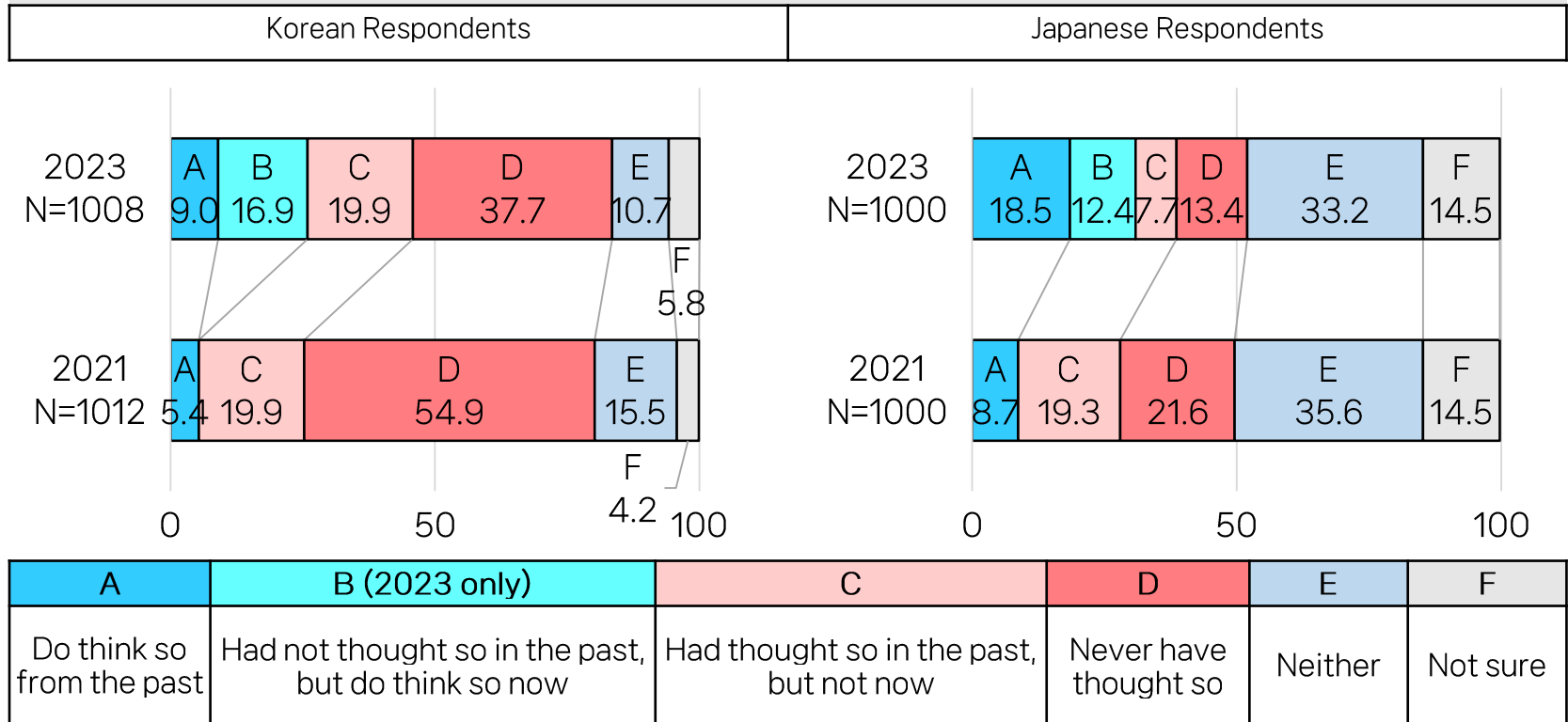

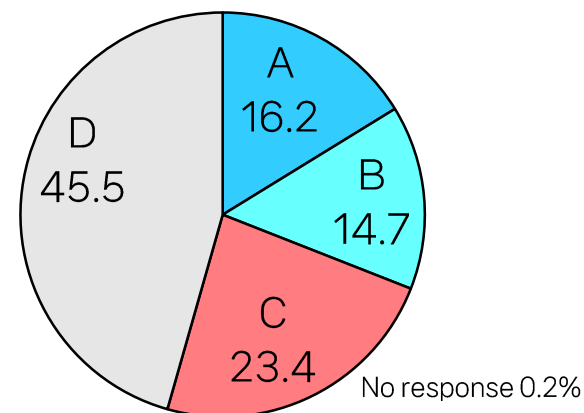

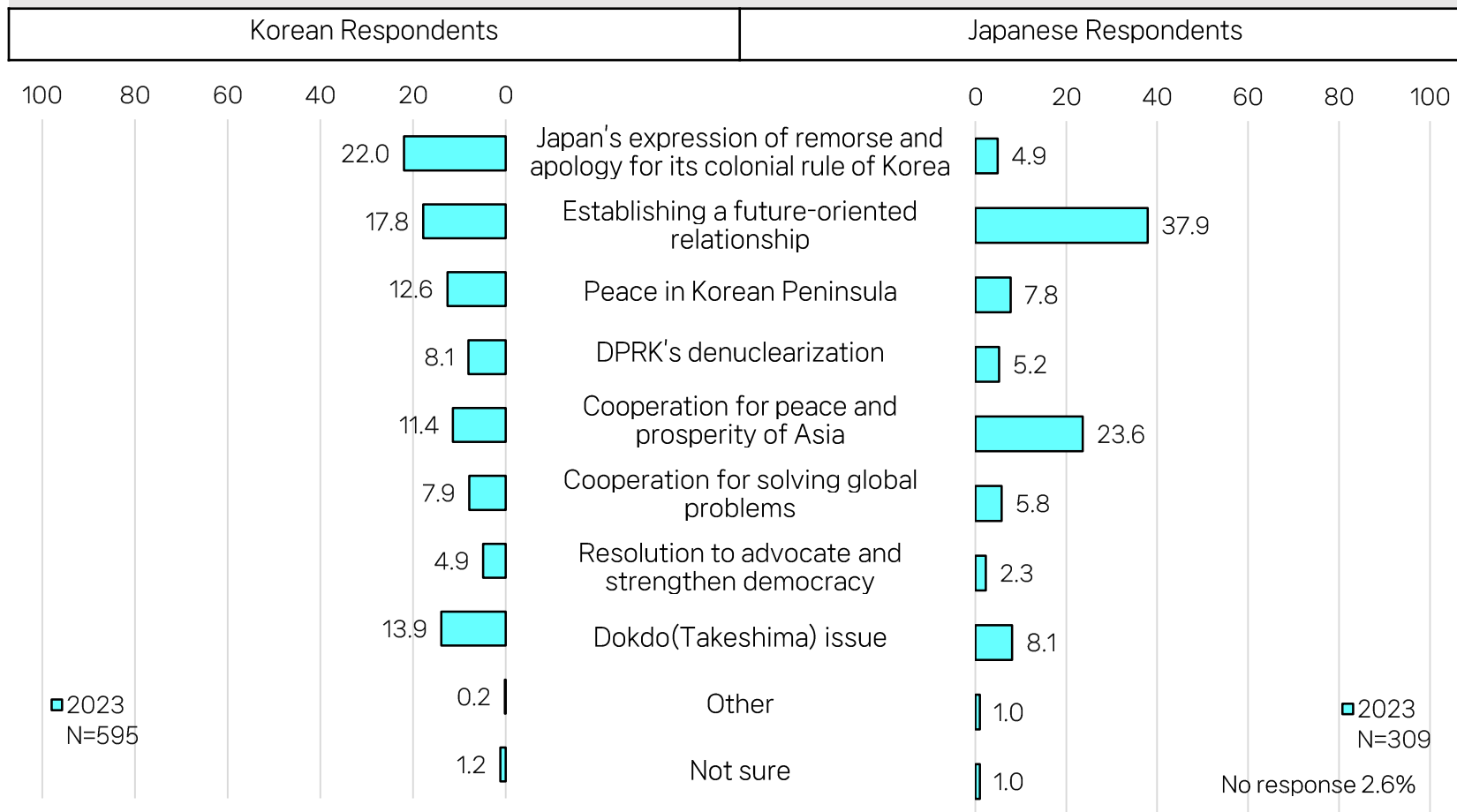

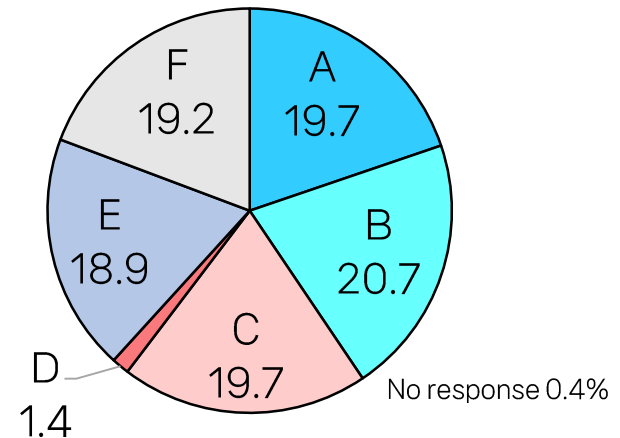

Q20. What kind of bilateral relationship do you believe South Korea and Japan should have in the future? (%)

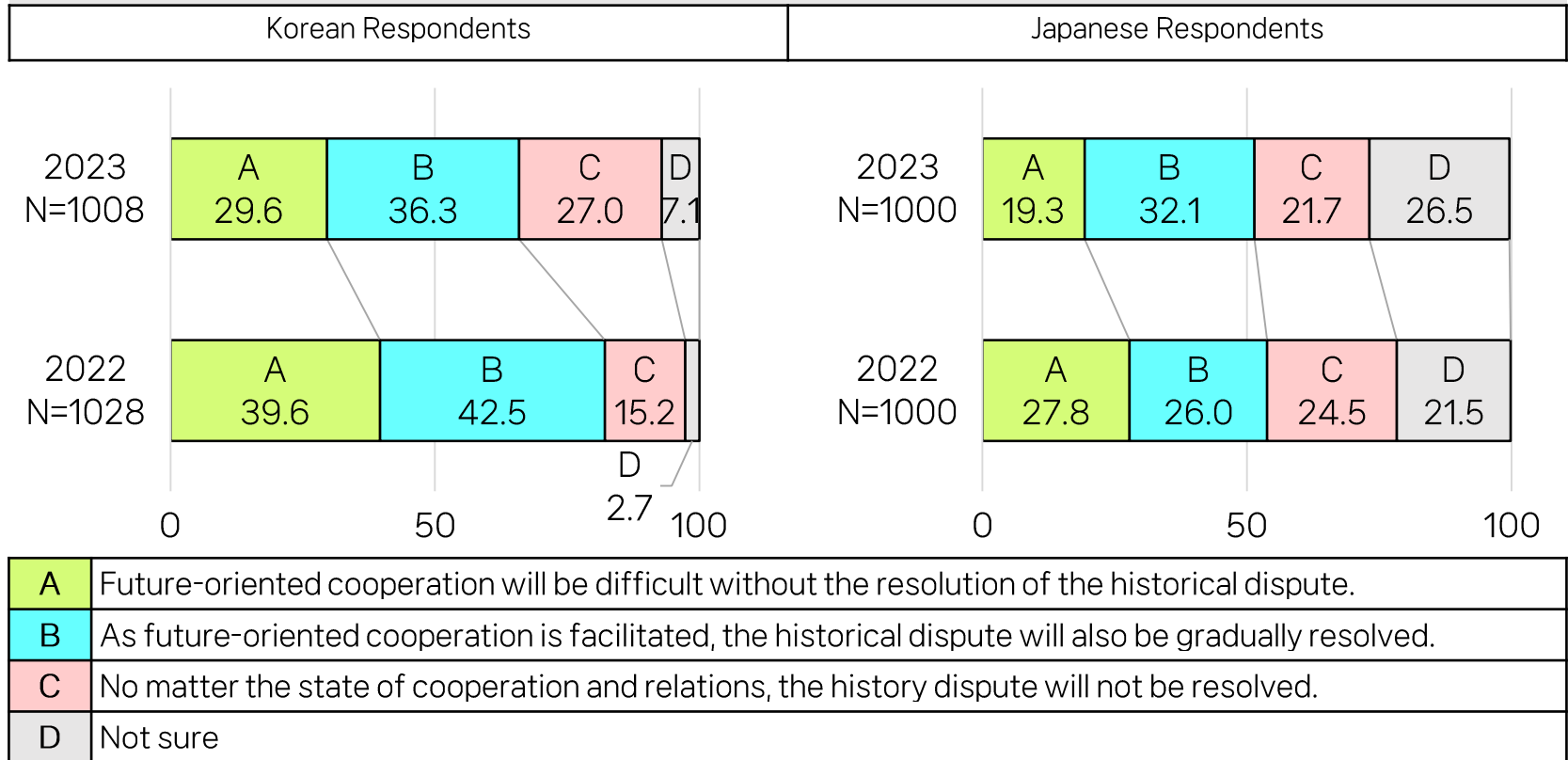

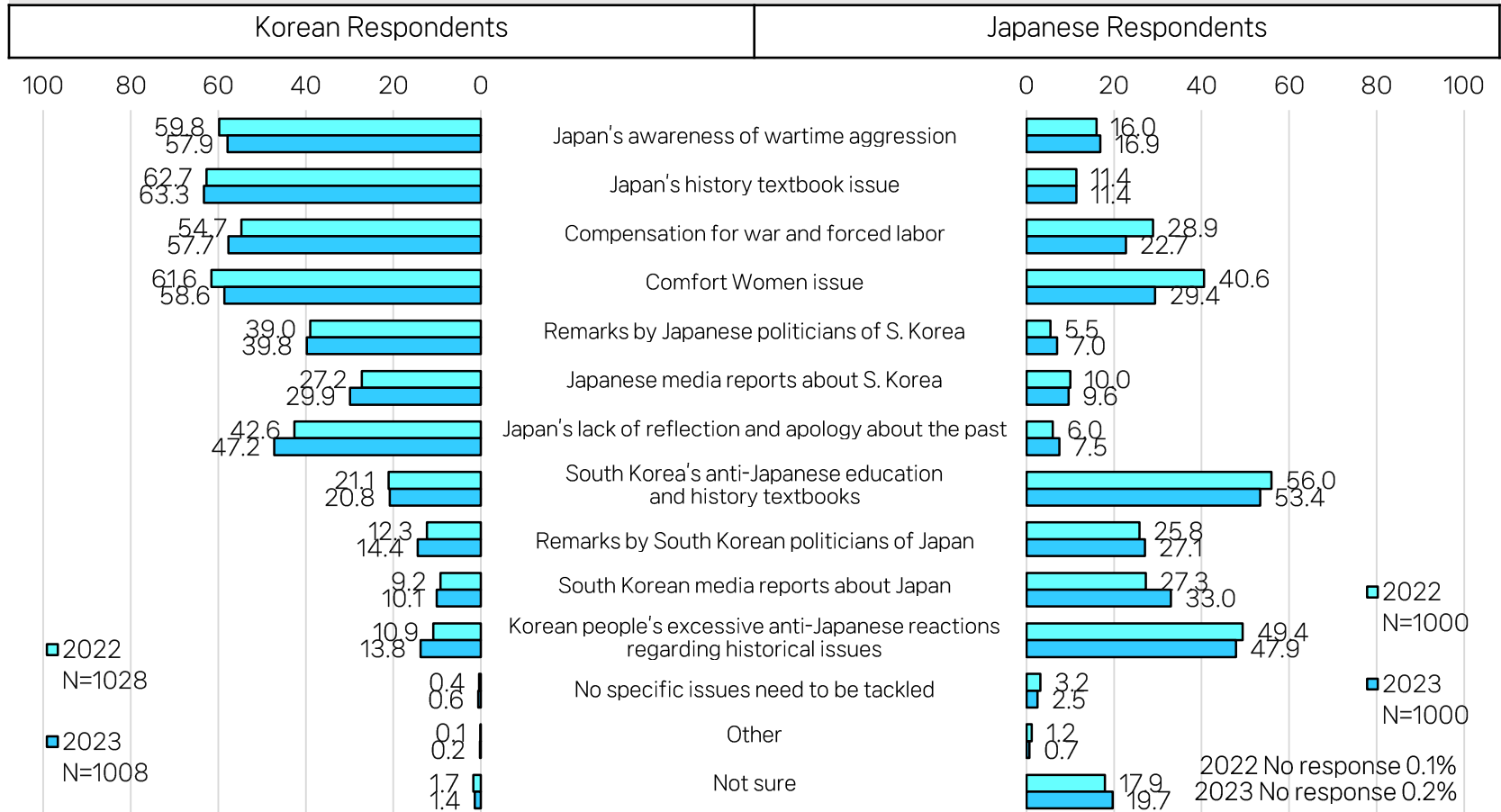

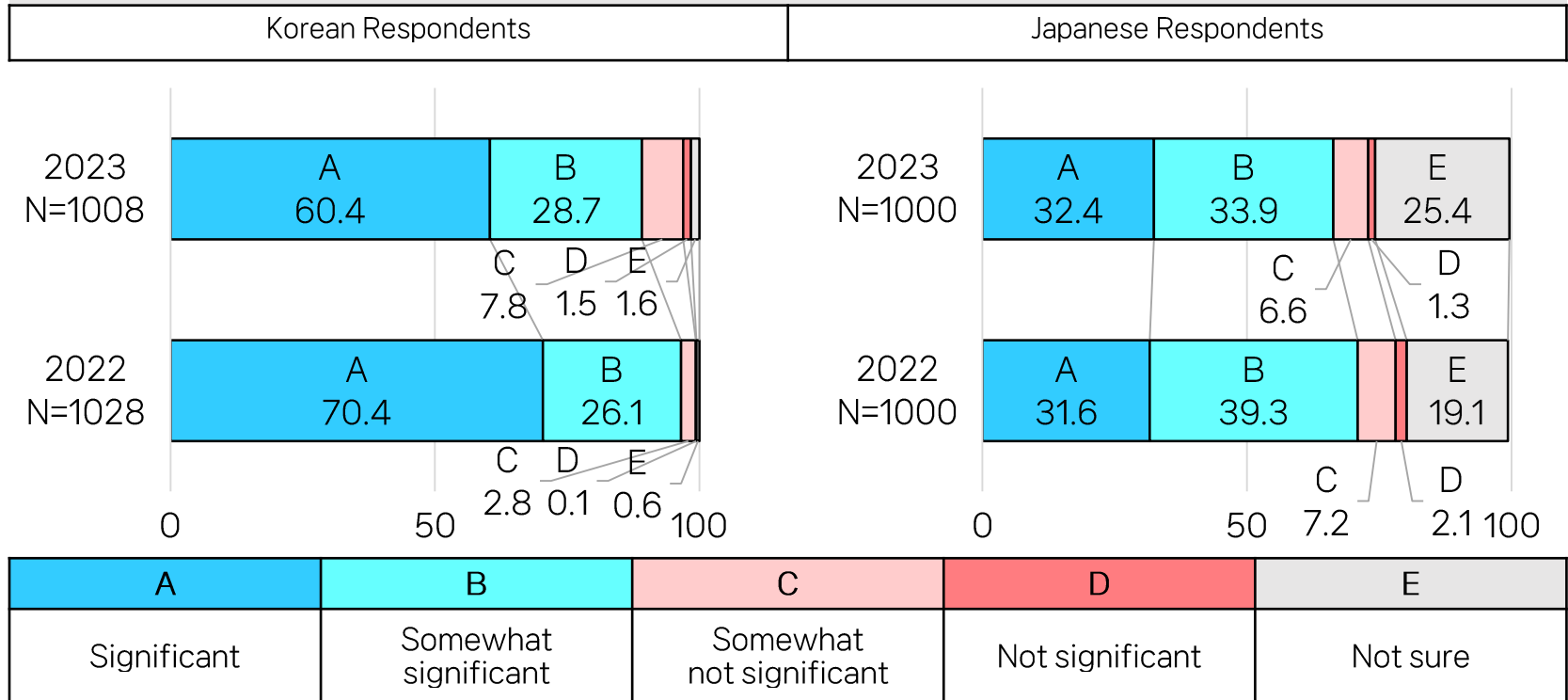
Q22. Which issues must be resolved regarding historical issues between South Korea and Japan? [Multiple responses]

Q23. How significant do you believe territorial disputes about Dokdo (Takeshima) are to the overall bilateral relations between Korea and Japan? (%)

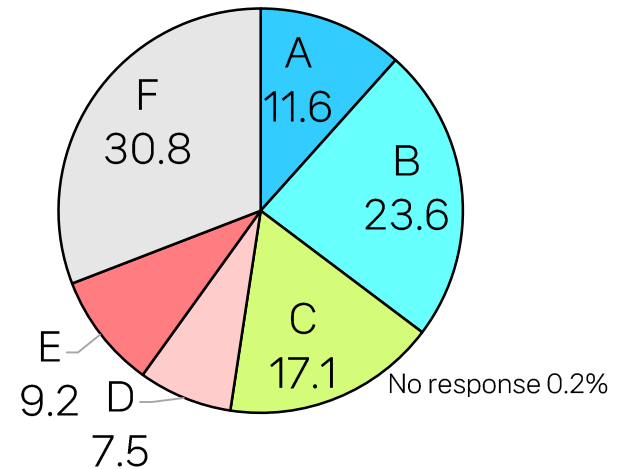
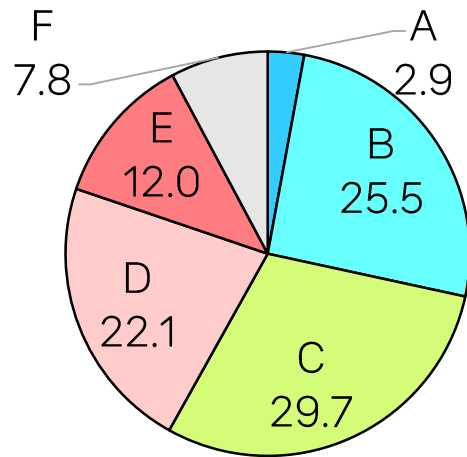

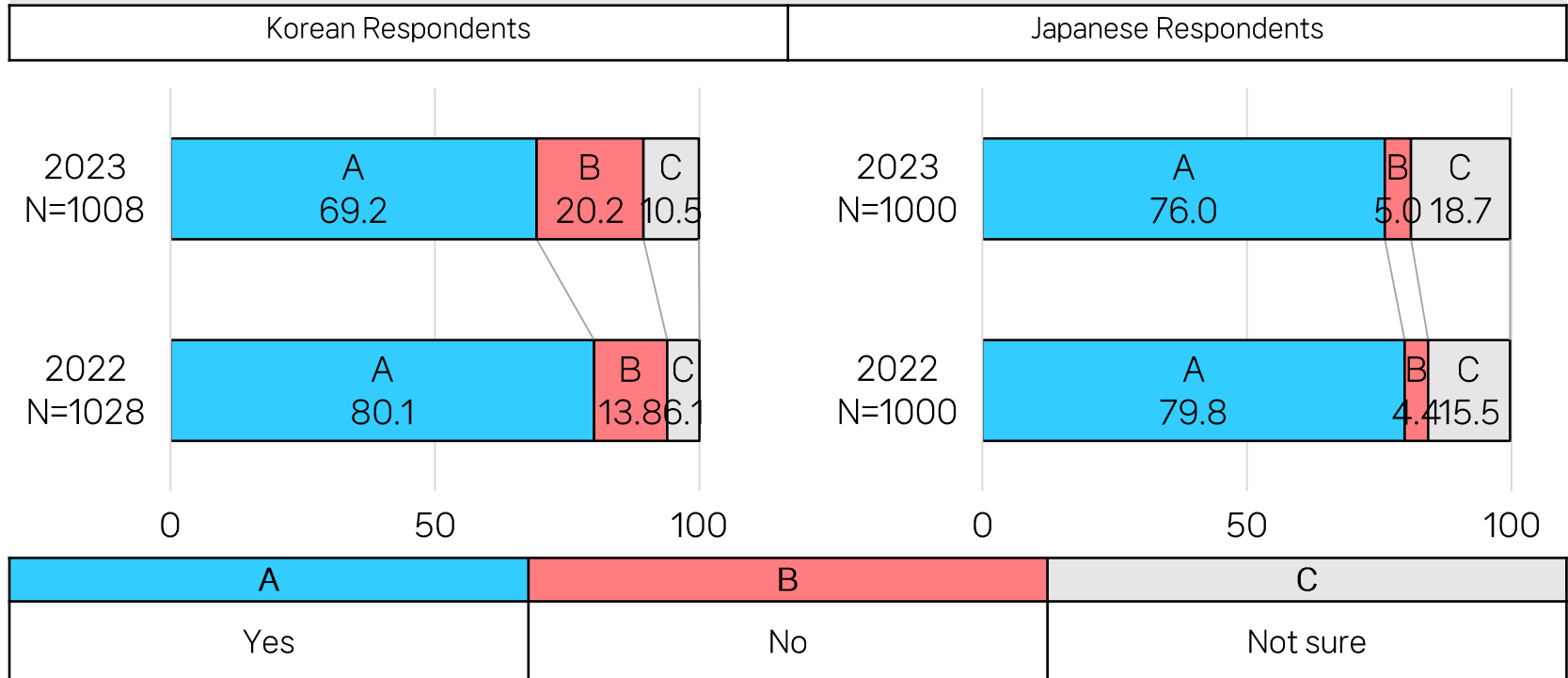

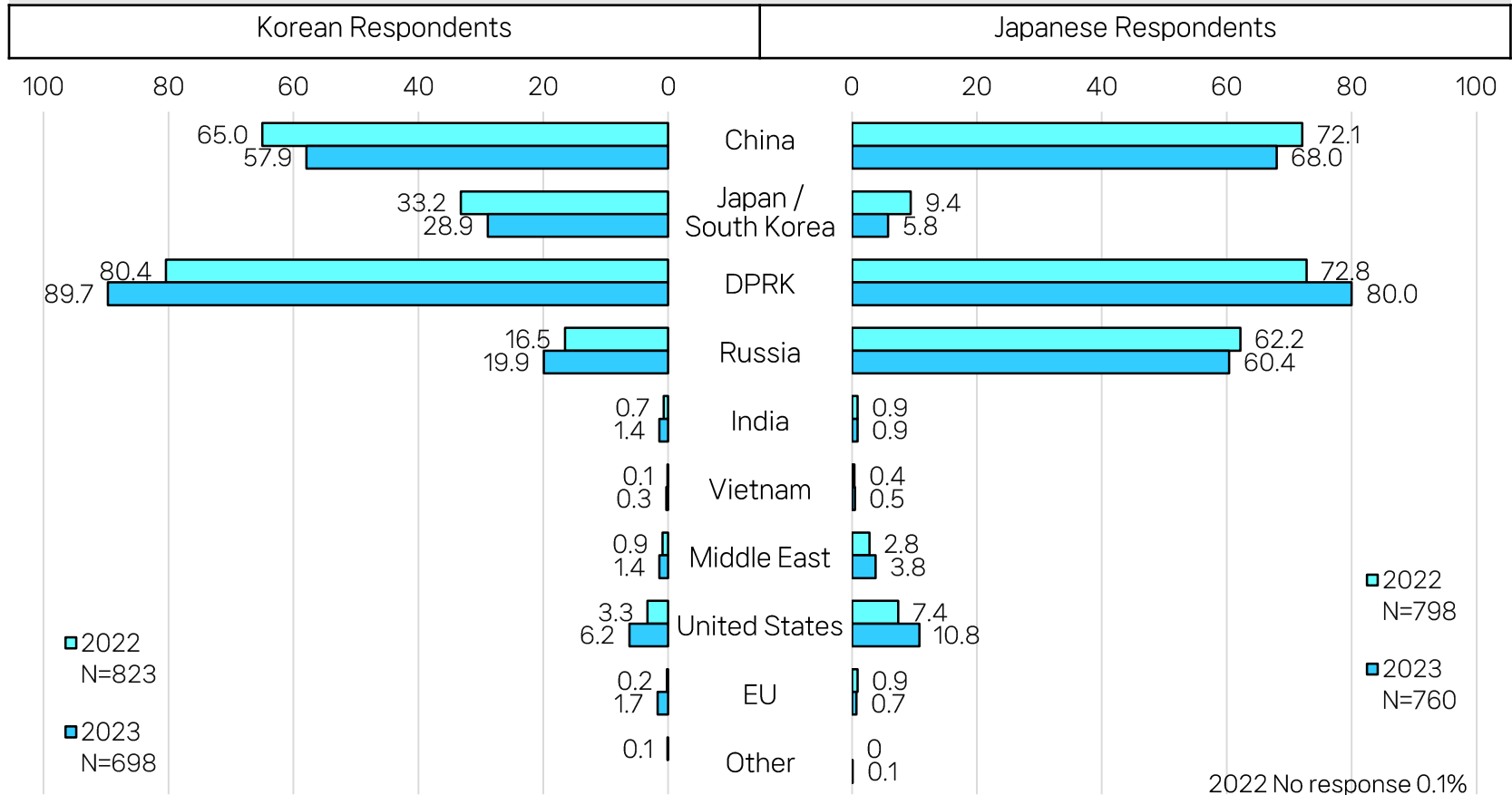
Q25. Do you think any countries or regions that you feel pose a military threat to your country? (%)

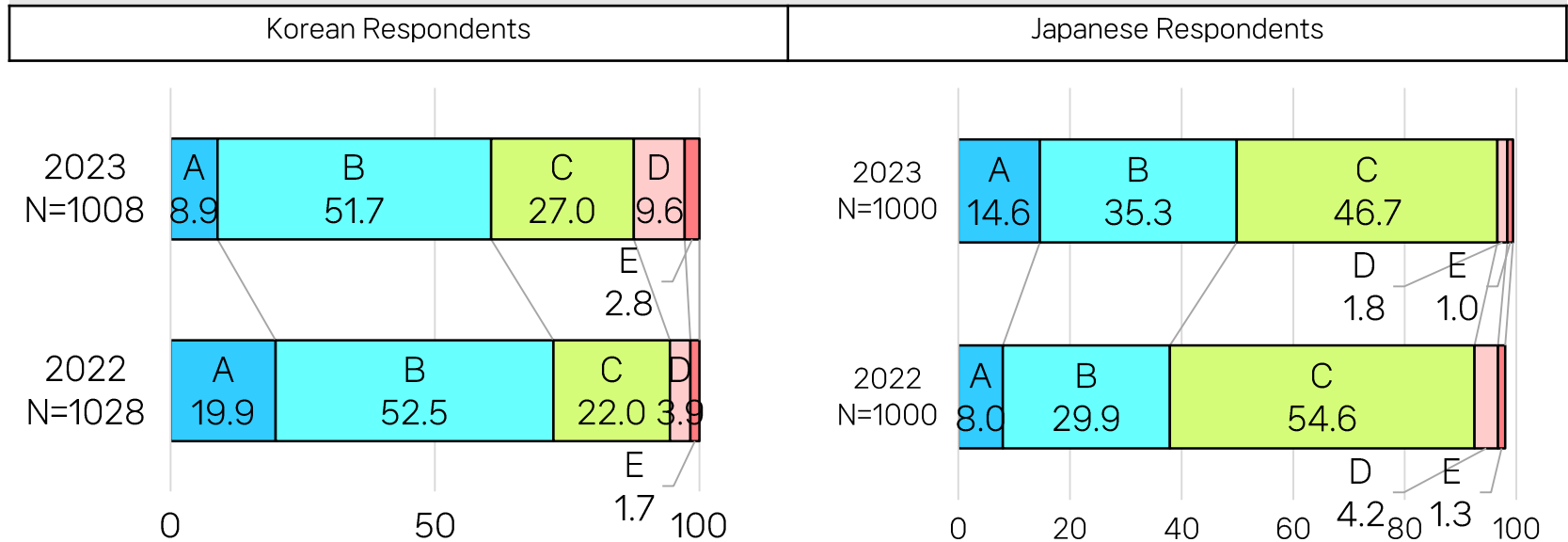

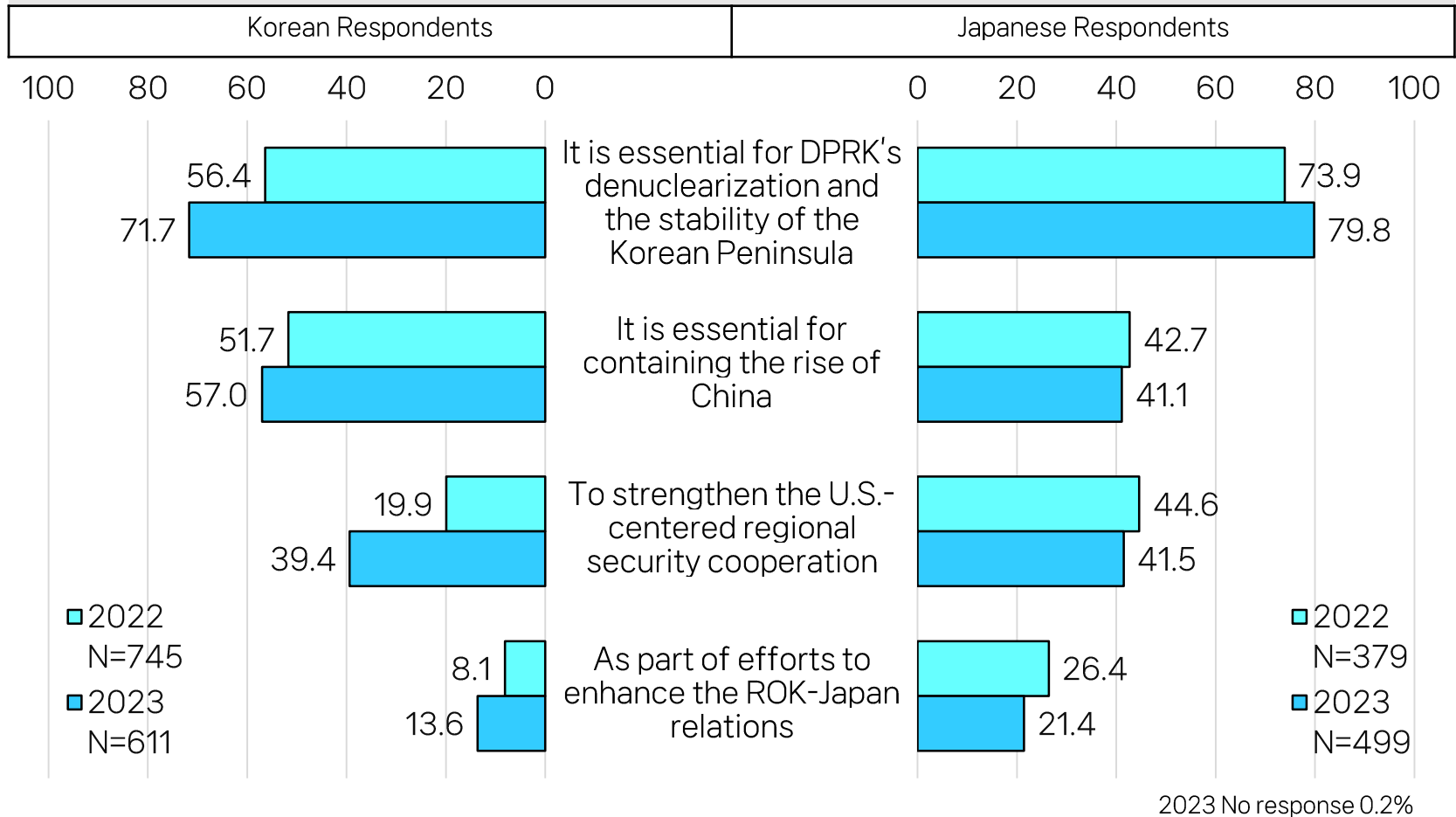

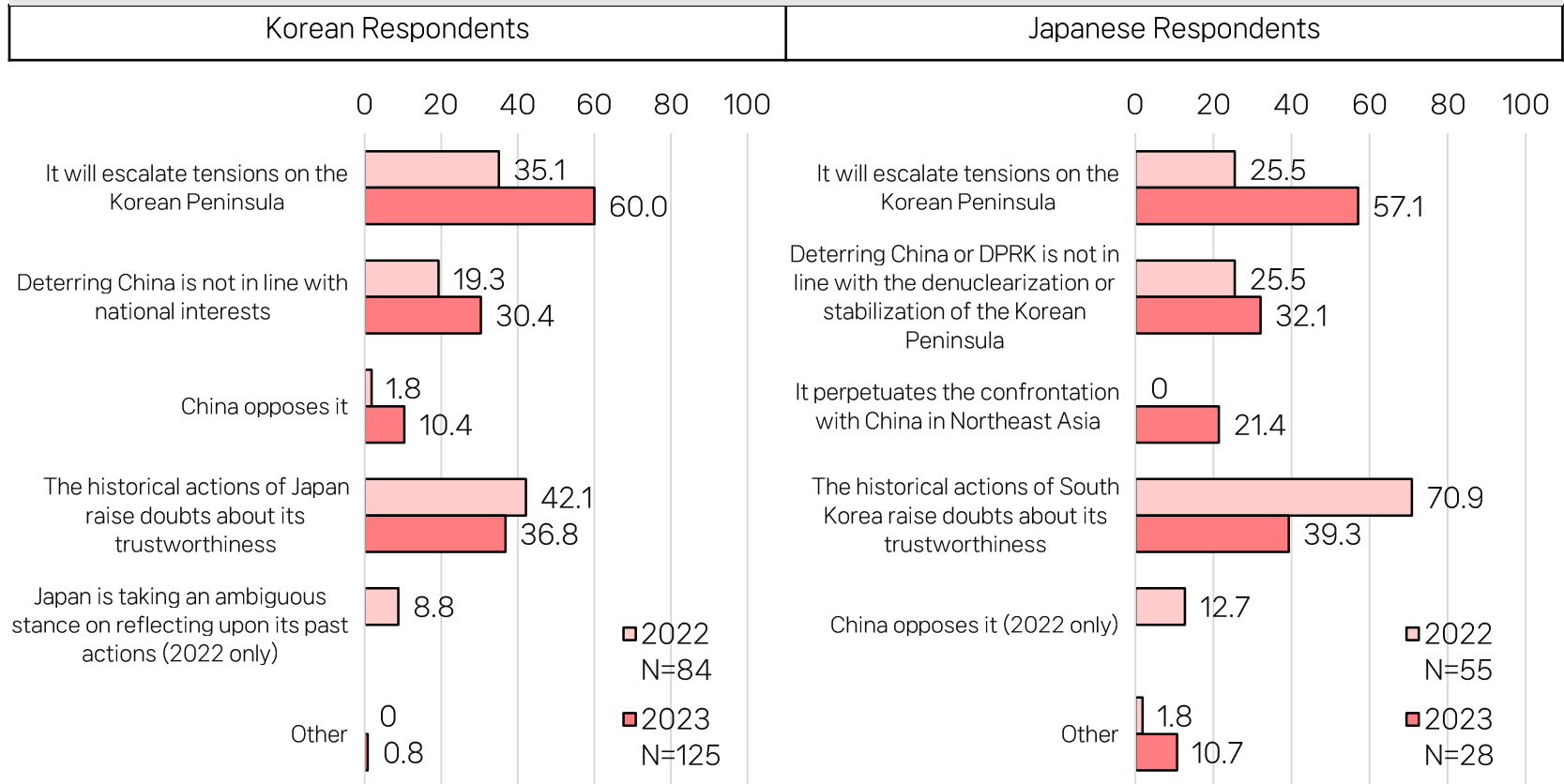

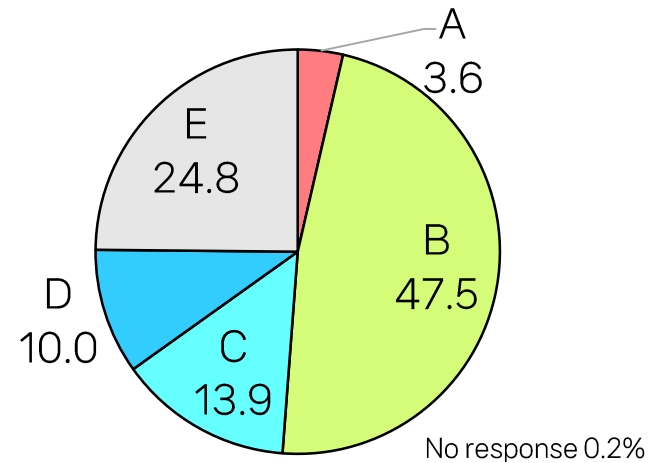
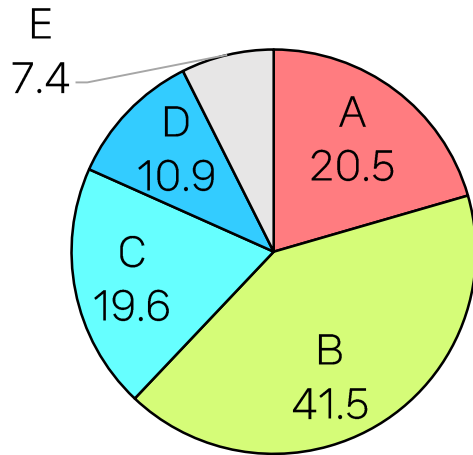

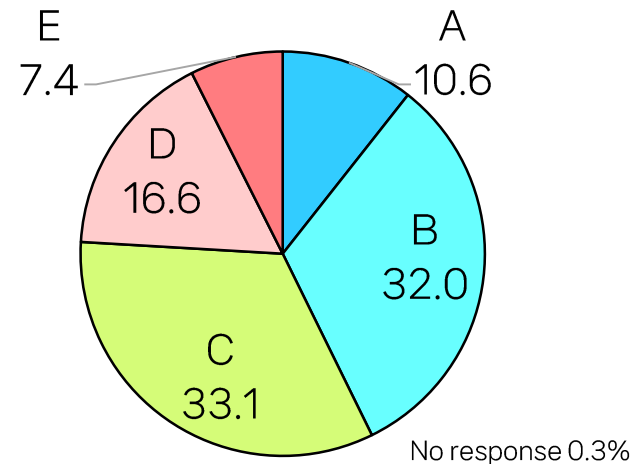

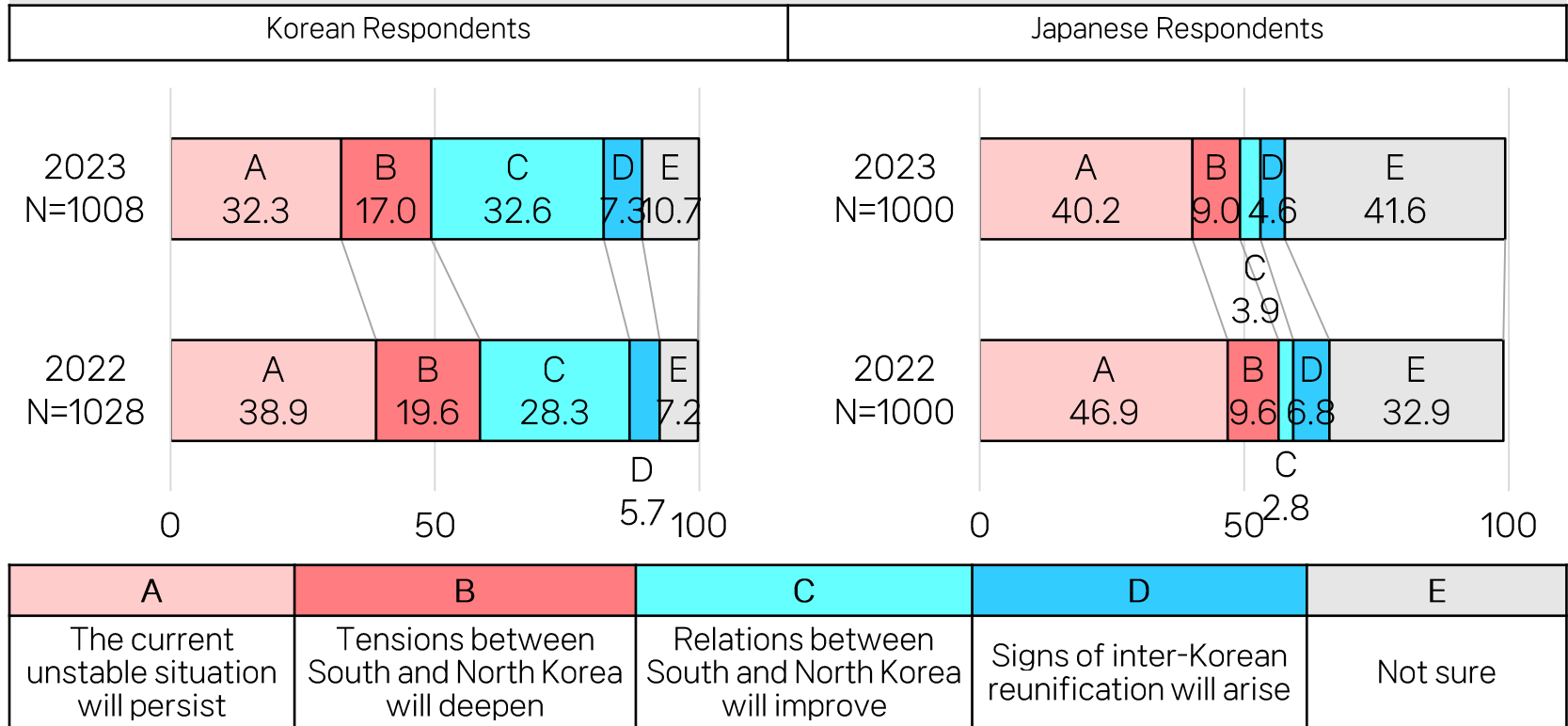

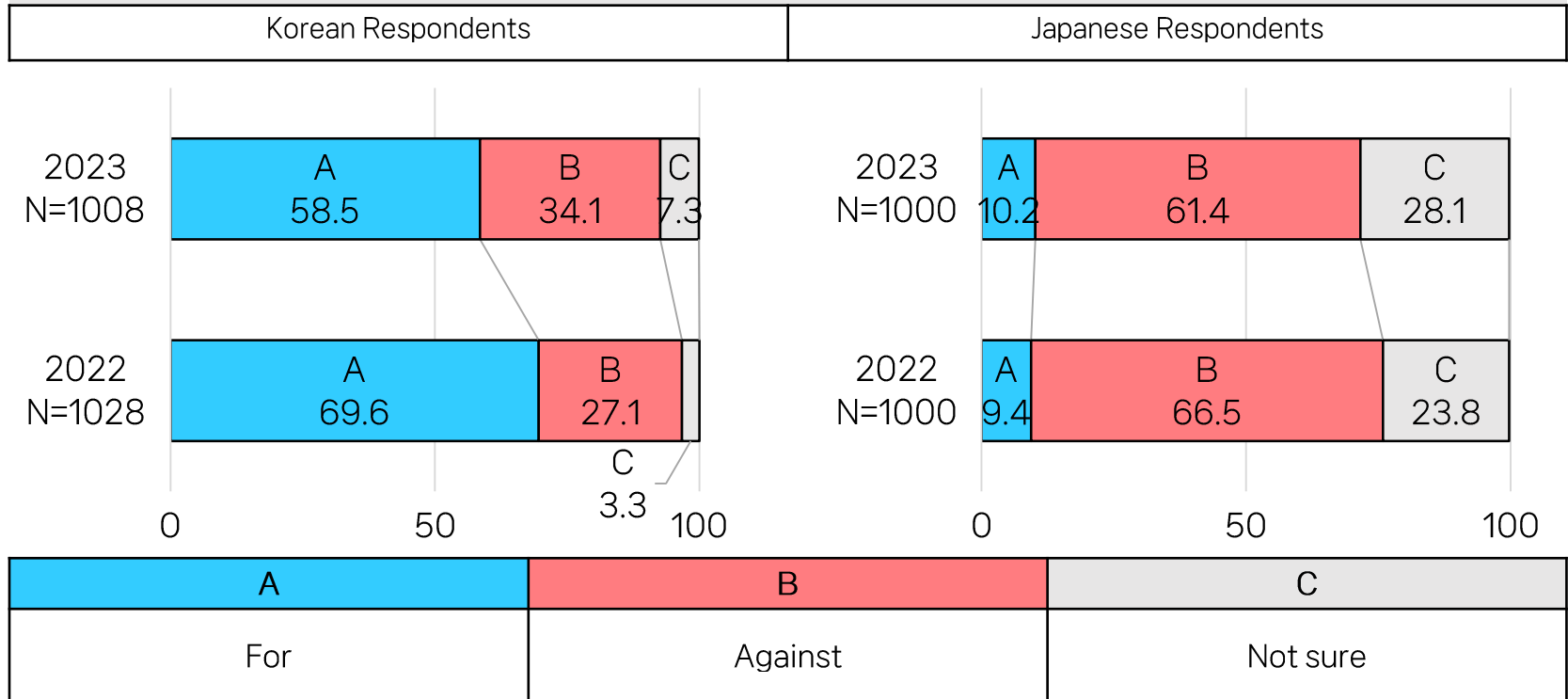

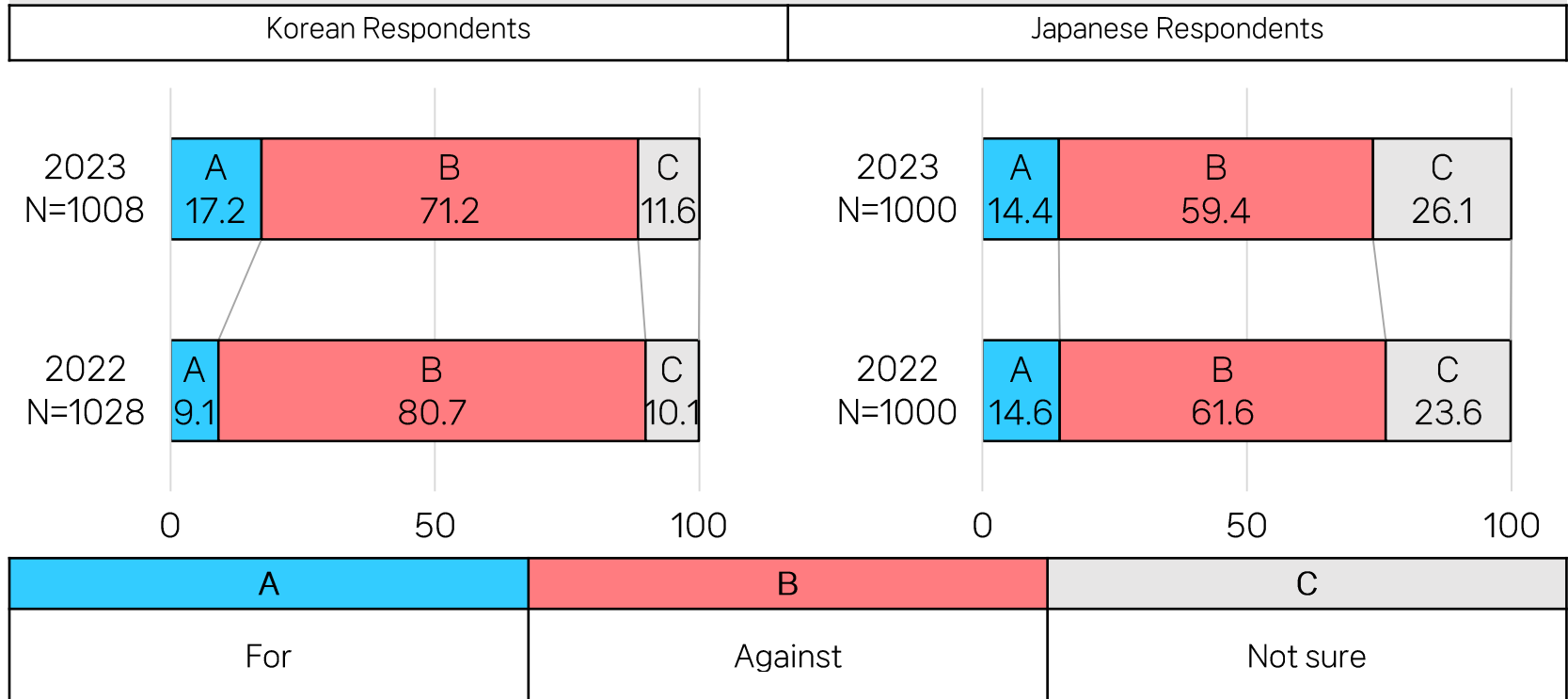

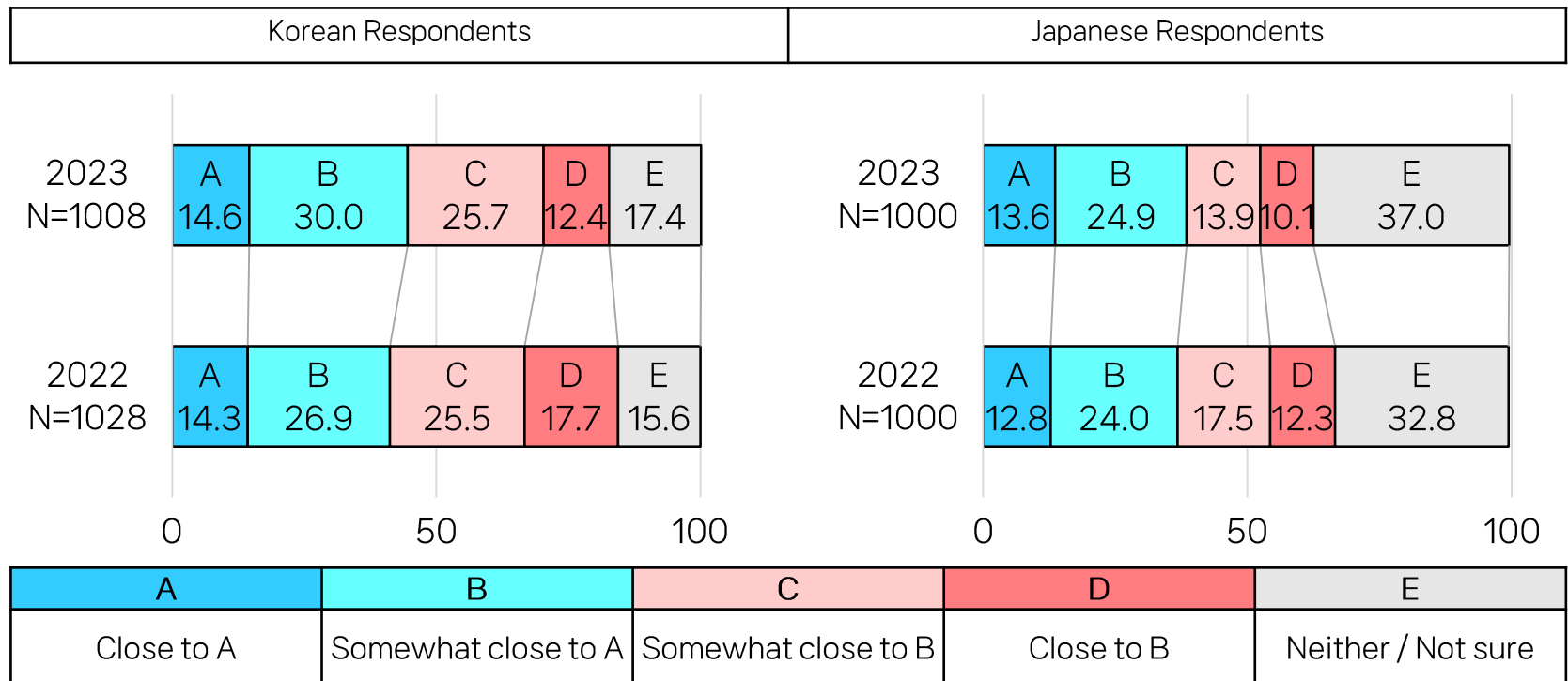


# Economic Relations Between South Korea and Japan

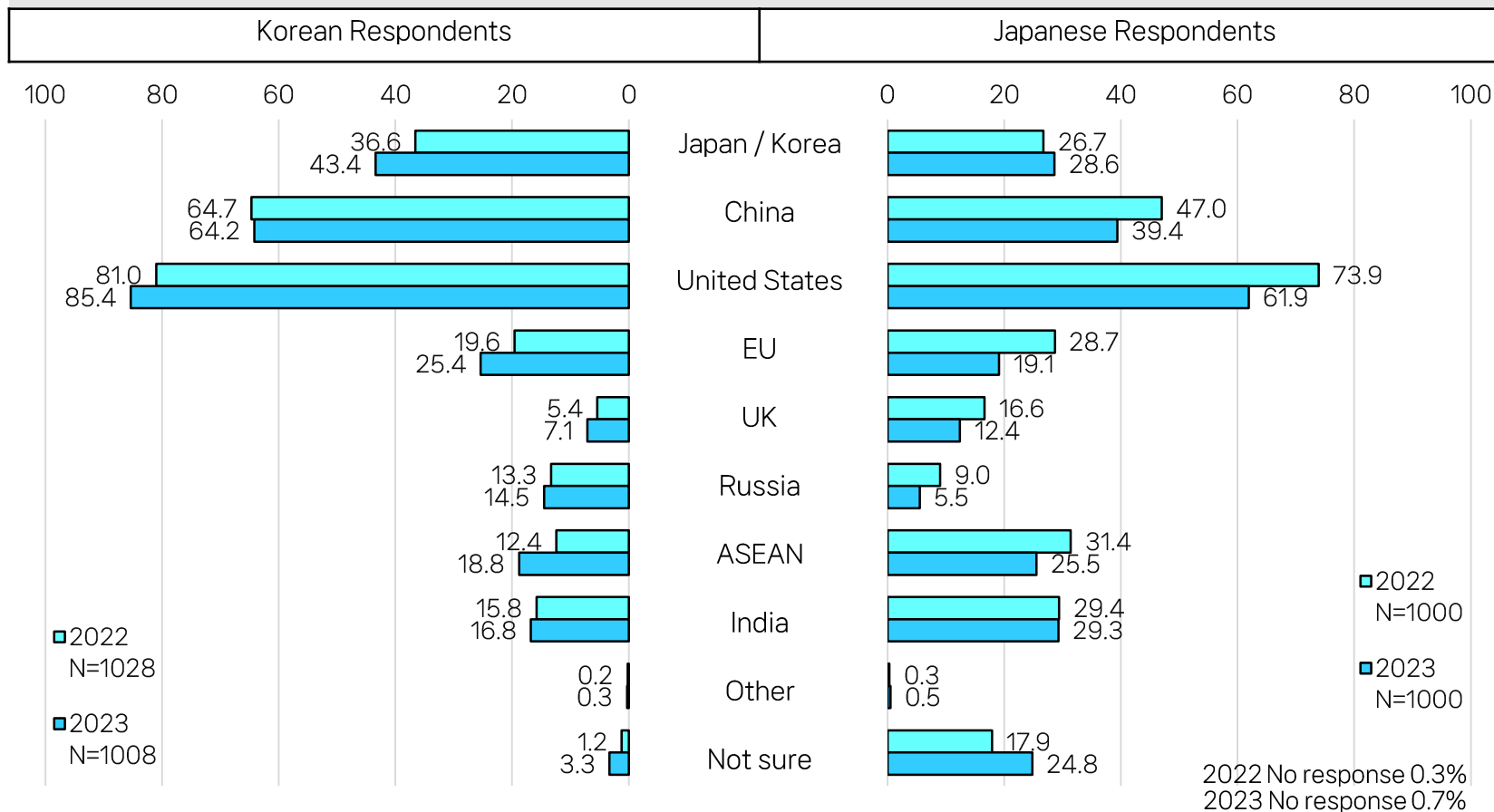

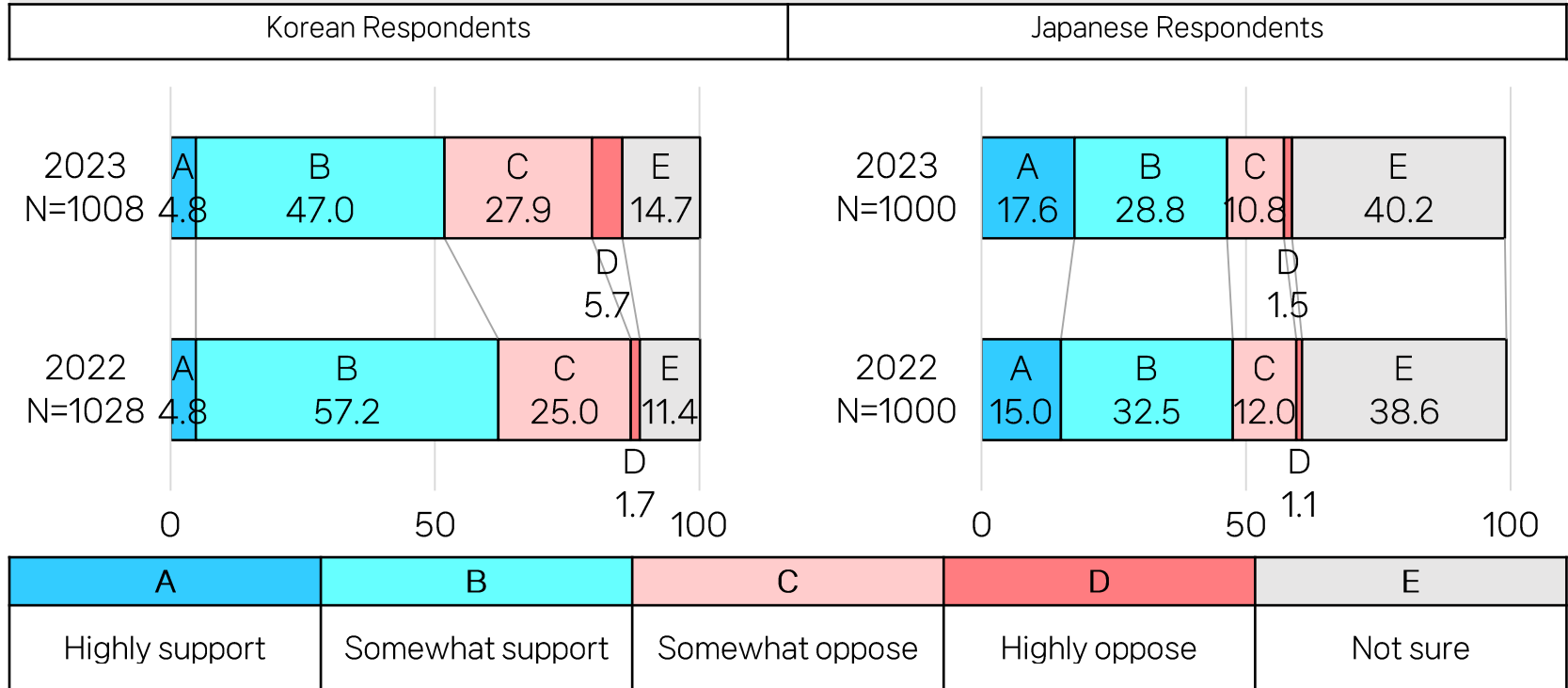
# Economically Important Countries and Regions

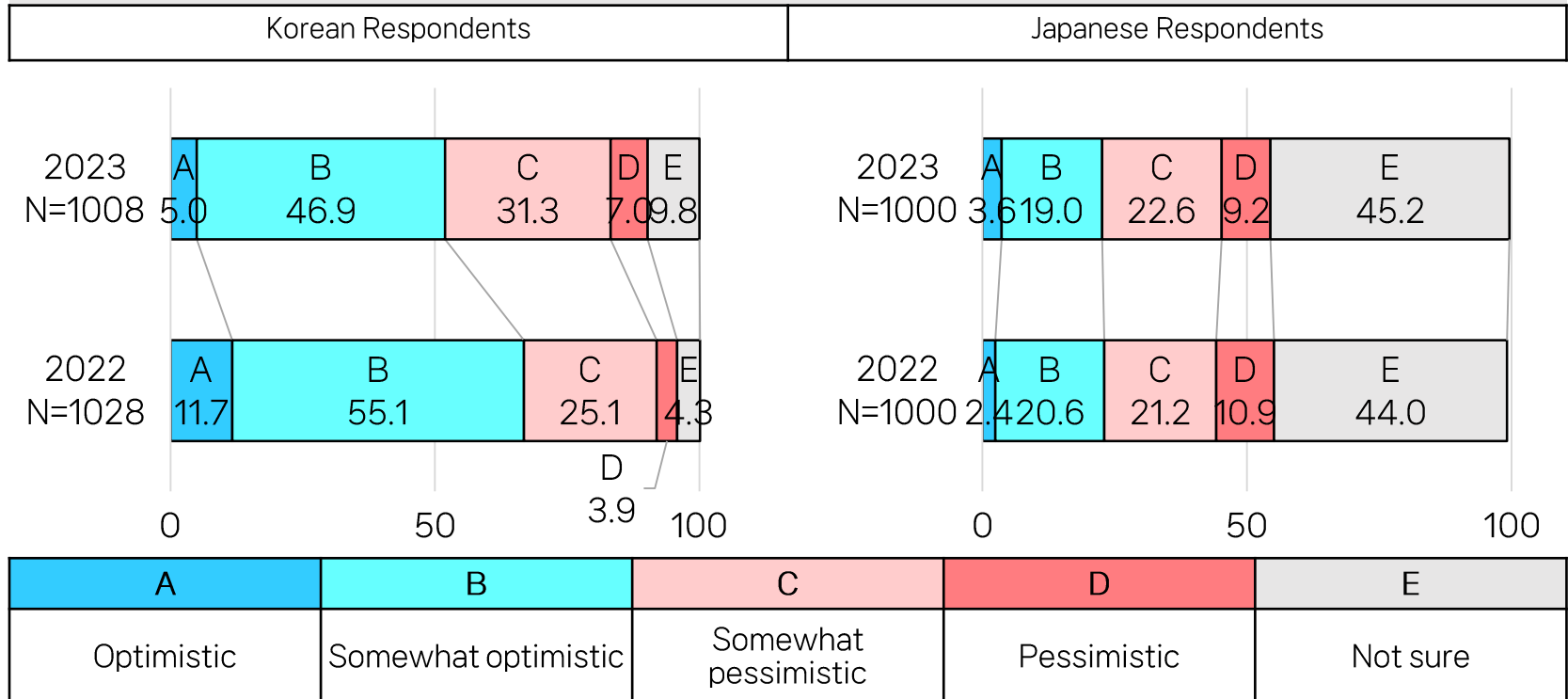

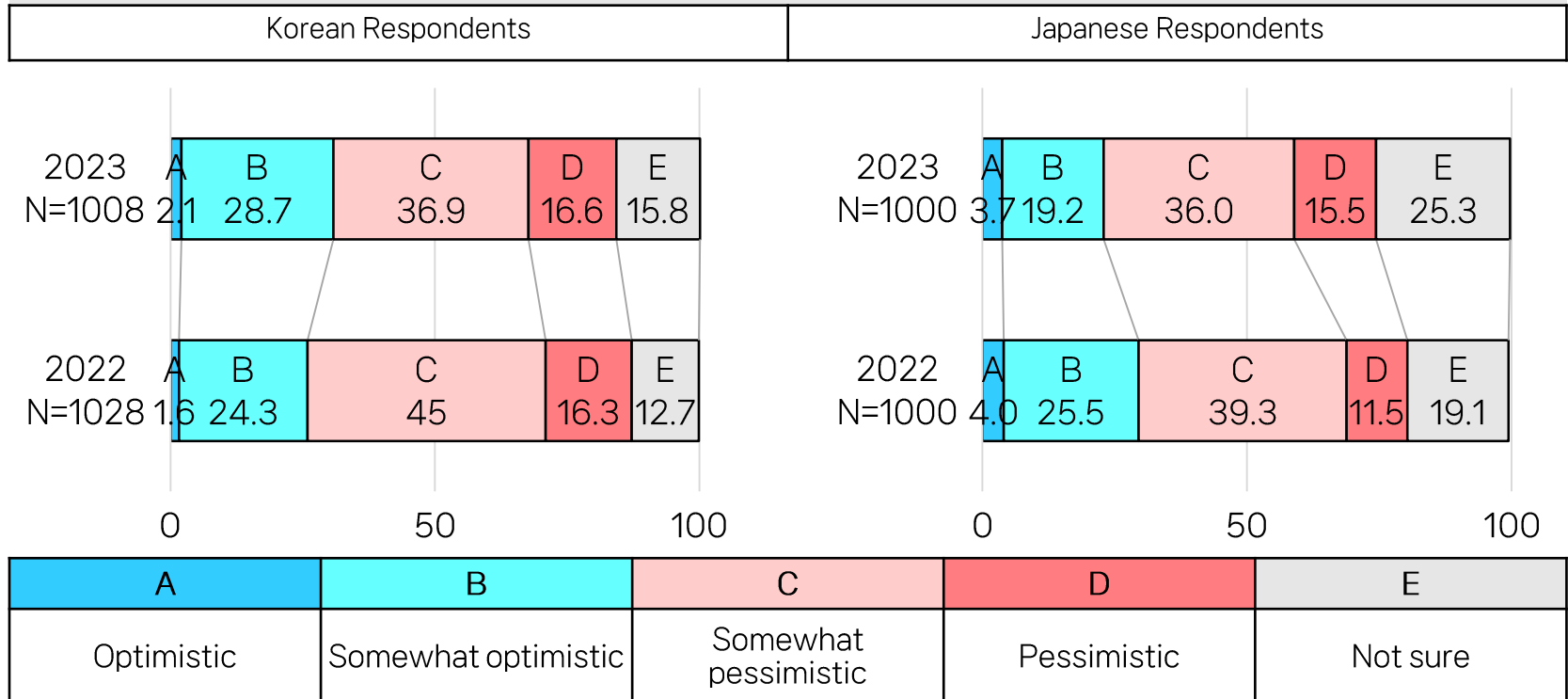

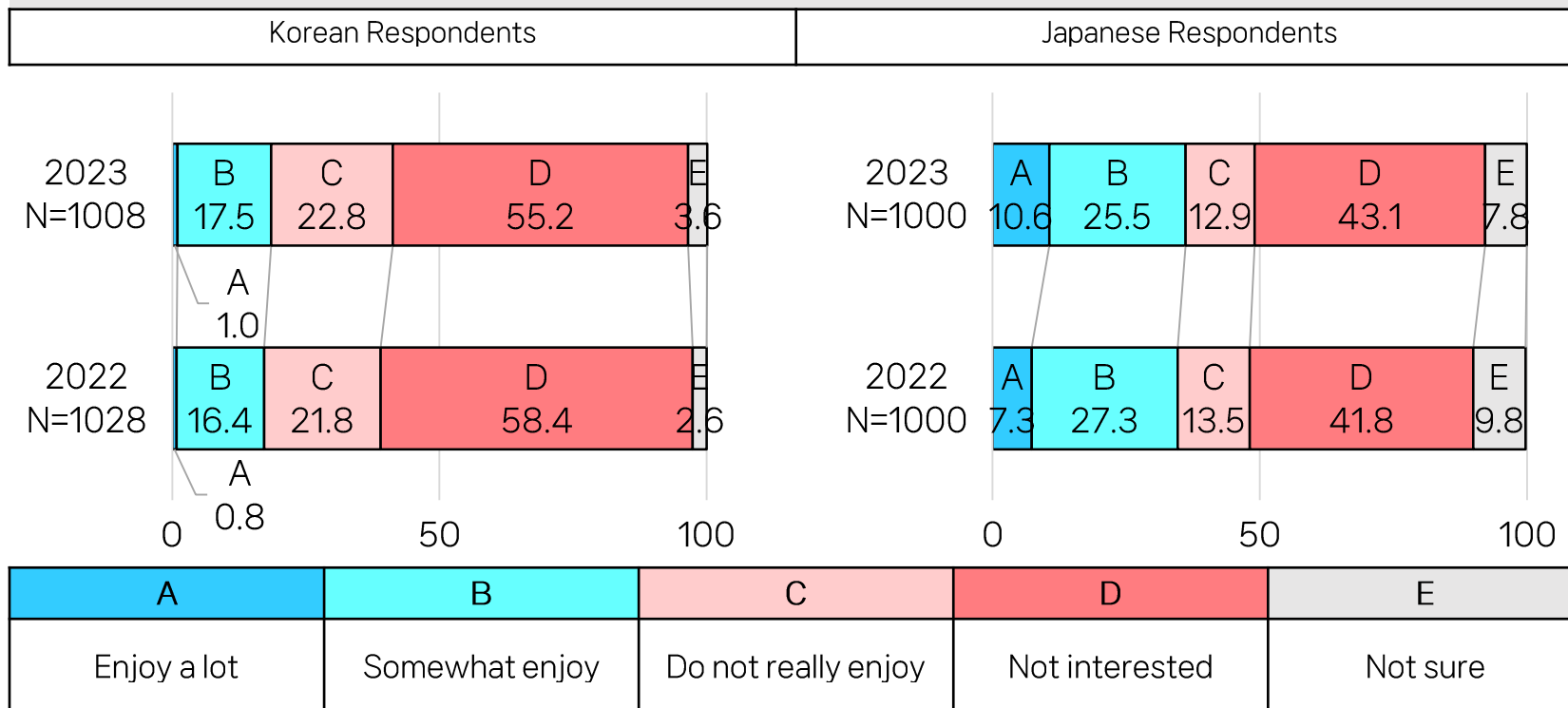

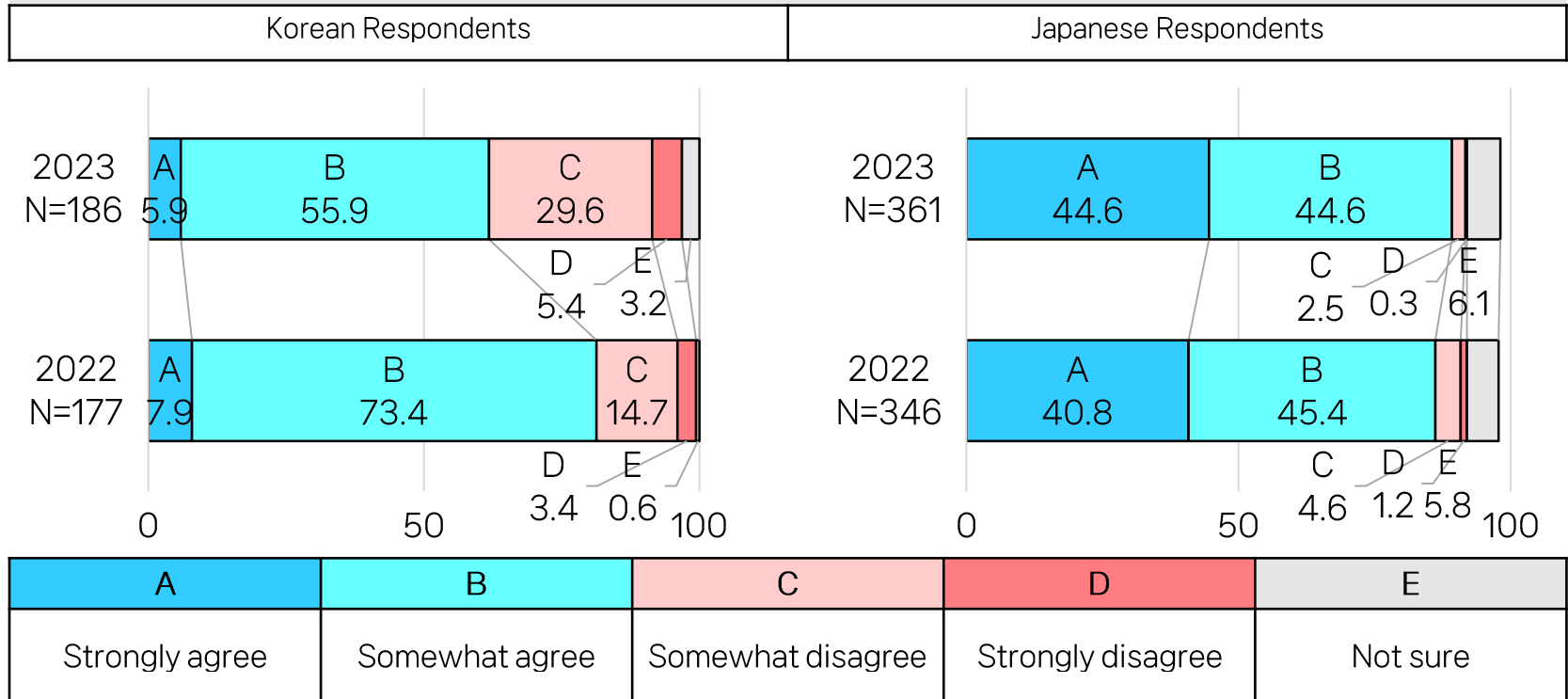

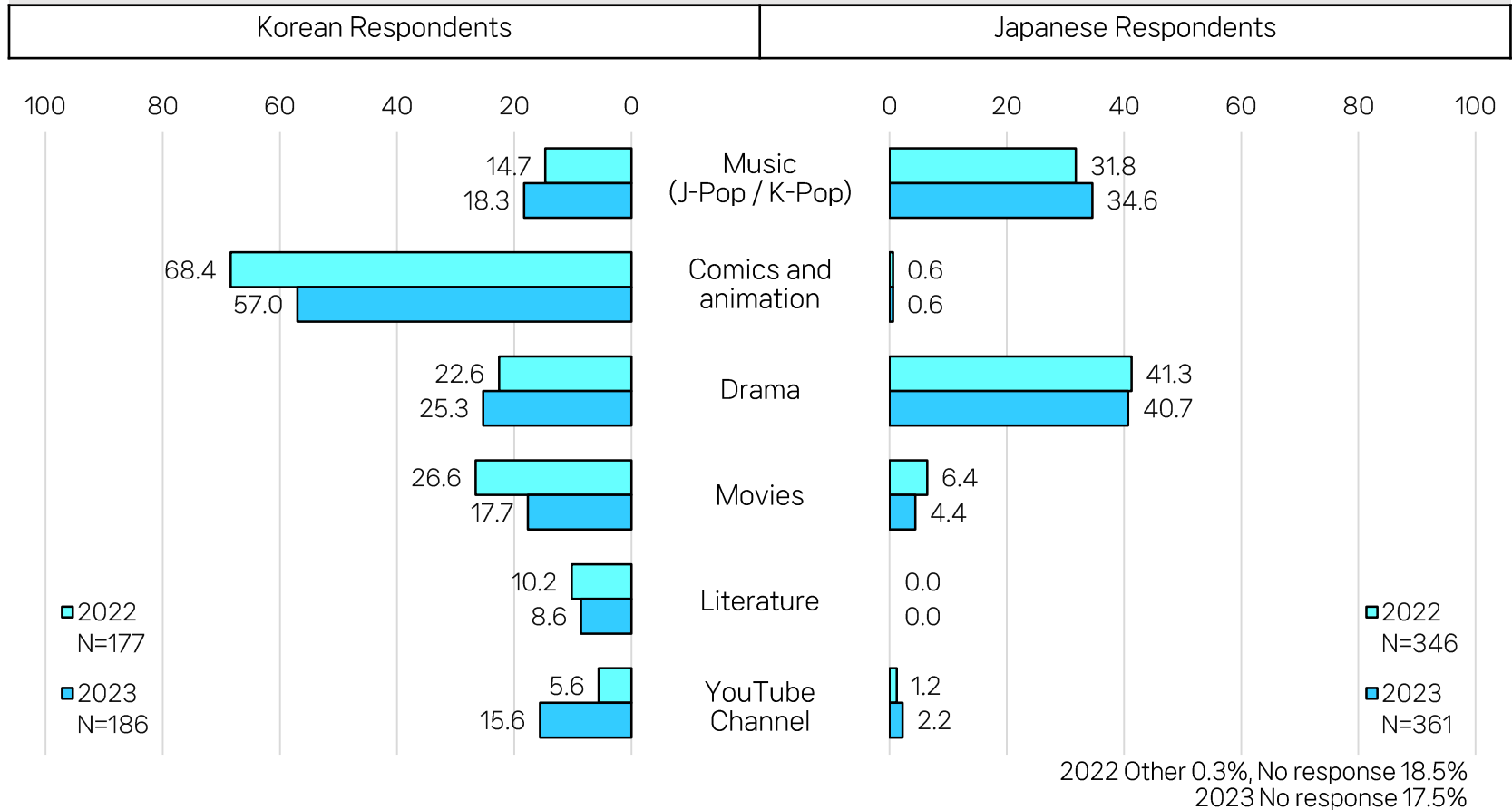

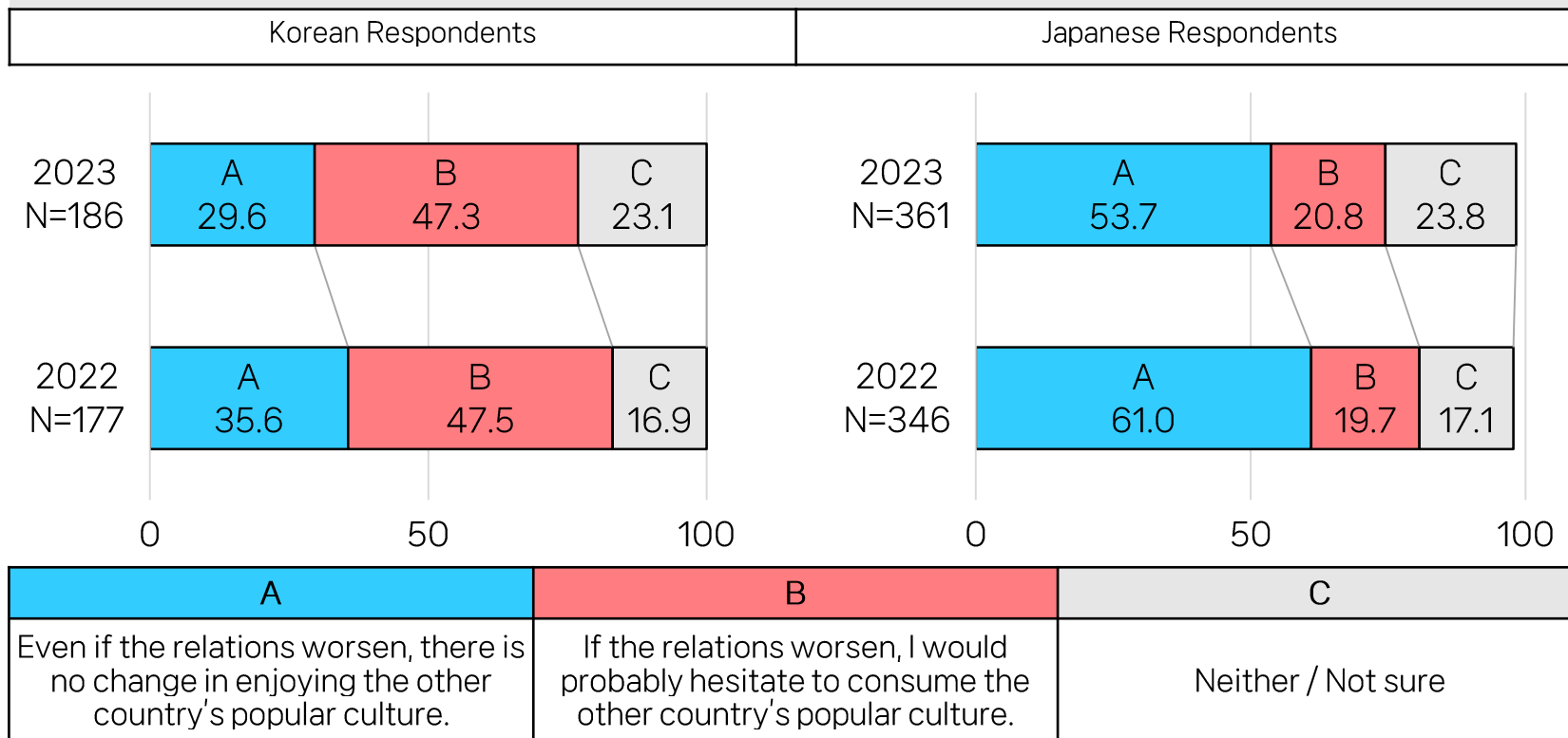

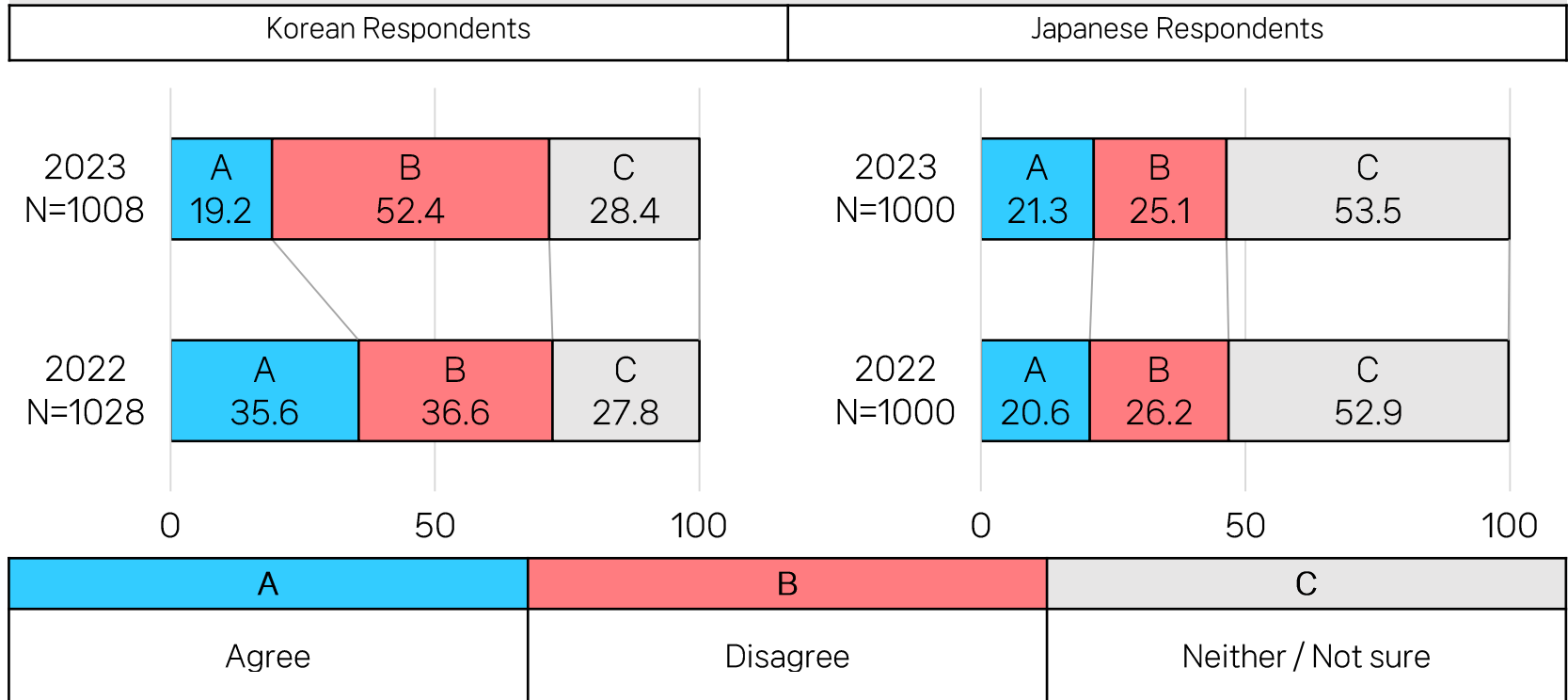

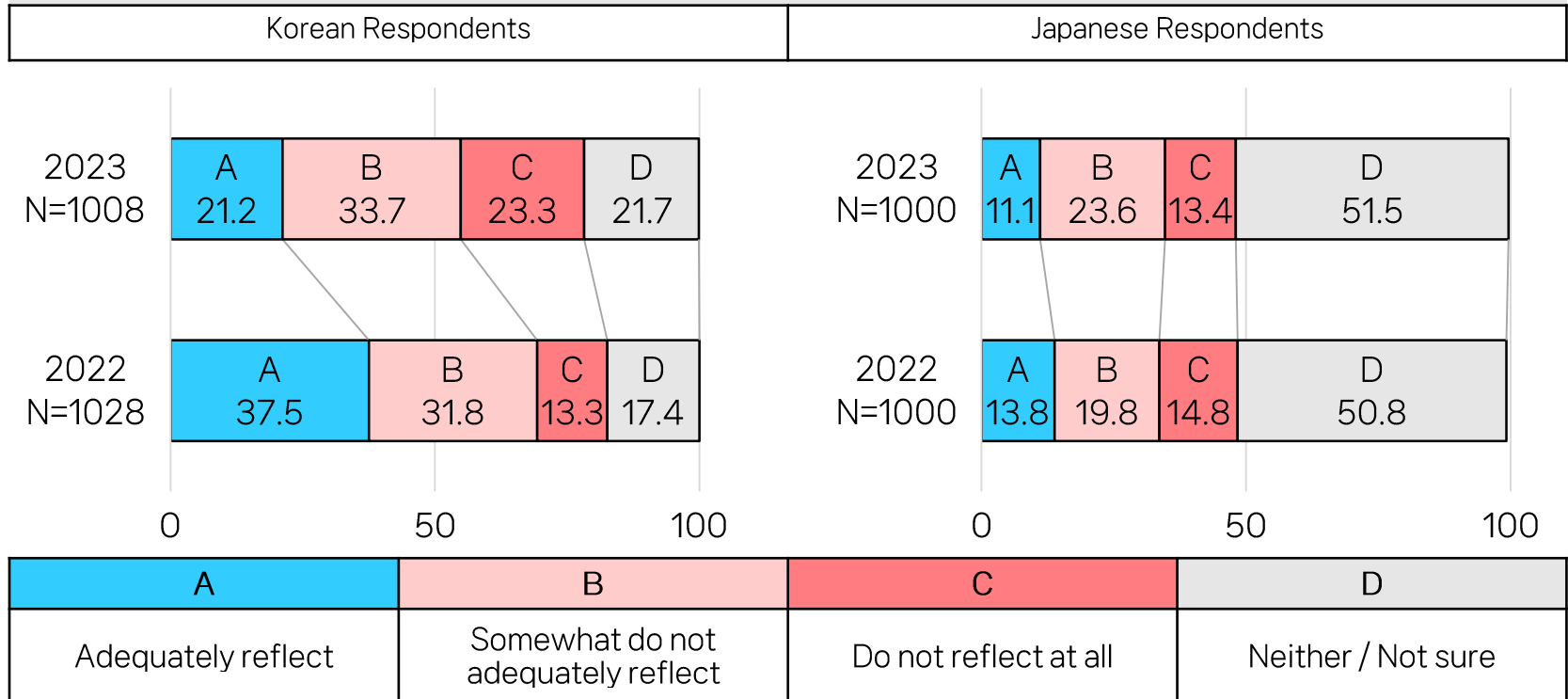
Q37. Do you think that newspapers, magazines, and broadcasts of your country provide objective and fair coverage of the ROK-Japan relations? (%)

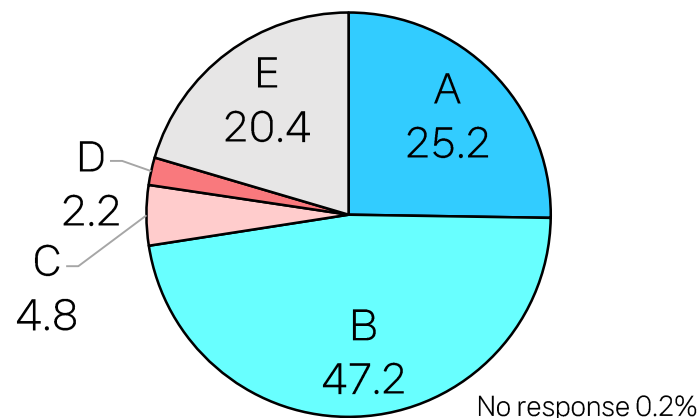
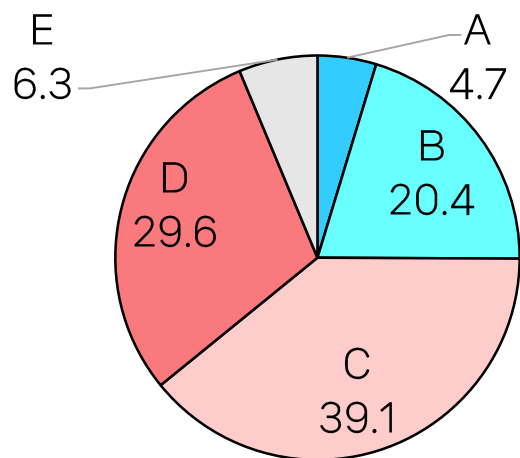
