

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
### Voting Behavior and Determining Factors

#### Opposition Support Dominates, "Luxury Bags" Issue Most Influential

- Comparing the answers of respondents who voted for their constituency and proportional representation in the 2024 legislative election with their answers in the 2022 presidential election, there is a slight increase in support for the Democratic Party and a slight decrease in support for the People Power Party.
- When asked about the nature of the 2024 general election, the majority of respondents did not agree with supporting the Yoon Suk Yeol government, while slightly more respondents agreed with supporting the opposition party.
- When asked about the influence of major issues in the general election on their vote, issues related to the President and the Presidential Office showed relatively high influence, including the controversy over the First Lady Kim Keon Hee's luxury handbag scandal (66.0%), the controversy over Ambassador to Australia Lee Jong Sup and Senior Presidential Secretary Hwang Sang-moo (58.6%), rising prices (58.2%), and the increase of the admission quota in medical schools (55.8%).




### Changes Needed in the Legislative Election System

#### Groups that Political Parties Need to Prioritize


In your opinion, which of the following groups should be prioritized by political parties in South Korea? [Up to two answers] (%)


### **Political Reform Tasks**

#### Reform of the Electoral System and Power Structure; Regulation of Proportional Representation Necessary

- 58.7% of respondents agreed that the current election system for the National Assembly needs to be revised, and among those who agreed, reasons included "breaking the polarization between major parties" (39.2%) and "reflecting the demographic and socioeconomic characteristics of the public" (25.3%).
- When asked about which groups Korean political parties should prioritize, youth (51.5%) and salaried employees (41.8%) were the top two answers.
- Regarding 'proportional representation parties,' which do not nominate candidates in constituencies but aim to secure proportional representation seats, 50.5% of respondents said that institutional regulation is necessary, which can be interpreted as a negative perception of attempts to circumvent the current election law, such as satellite parties.


### Sources of Information about the Elections




How fair do you think the 22<sup>nd</sup> legislative election was?




### Impartiality of Election Administration Process

#### A Majority Felt the 2024 General Election Was Generally Fair, but 40 Percent Expressed Distrust in Early Voting

- 39% of respondents said there was organized fraud in the 2020 General Election, while 20.9% said there was fraud in the 2024 General Election.
- When asked about their confidence in the National Election Commission's election management, 33.9% said they did not trust the overall management, and 40.8% said they did not trust the early voting management.
- The main reasons for mistrust in the Election Commission were the early voting's vulnerability to manipulation and the Election Commission's dismissive response to the suspicions raised.
- While there is no consensus on allegations of organized election fraud, there is public mistrust in the election's fairness due to the Election Commission's poor management and inadequate response to suspicions.

### Fairness and Conflict in Korean Society

#### Unfair, Full-scale Conflict Society, a Gap Between Voter Perception and Social Phenomena

- In each of the following categories: education, employment, distribution, and gender, only 10% of South Koreans feel that society is fair.
- When queried about the intensity of conflicts among major groups within Korean society, a majority of respondents indicated that these conflicts are either "very strong" or "somewhat strong" across all categories. Specifically, 62.8% of respondents perceived the conflicts between ruling and opposition parties as very strong, while 55.8% felt the same about conflicts between conservatives and progressives. These figures each represent more than half of the total respondents, highlighting significant perceived discord in these areas.
- This stands in contrast to the results of the "Survey on Perceptions of Fake News and Misinformation," conducted by EAI in January 2024. In that survey, 45% of respondents identified themselves as centrists, and no signs of ideological extremism were observed. This discrepancy highlights a significant gap between voters' self-perceived ideological positions and their perception of the ideological landscape as reflected by social phenomena.
- Meanwhile, the proportion of respondents who said that gender conflict is very or somewhat strong was 56.7%, the lowest level of conflict among the groups presented in the question.
